INCORPORATIONS.—Southern Oregon Lumber and Mfg. company at Central Point, Jackson county, on \$12,000, by C. Magruden, J. B. Williams, H. C. Lewis, J. W. Merritt and D. Linn. Phineas Peck, John Campbell, and H. Lavender, incorporate the Verona church, of the Evangelical association of North America. Estimated value of the property \$25. The First Methodist church of Halsey, by J. N. VanWinkle, Joseph Pearl, John Bateman, Elias Keeney and Aery Kirk, who say that the organization has \$2,000. Five thousand dollars and R. C. Rose, W. Blackman and H. B. Dyer, in Portland, will help The Oregon Bureau of Information to locate settlers on government and state lands, and to encourage immigration, furnish accurate and reliable information of resources and maintain an exhibit of the products of Oregon. G. P. Frank, F. A. Knapp and A. S. Frank, of Portland, by way of supplement, say that the capital stock of the Frank Bros. Implement company, shall be \$250,000. Articles were filed in the office of the secretary of state.

J. C. Carson, H. B. Miller, H. C. Kinney, J. F. Kelley and R. A. Booth file supplementary articles of the Sugar Pine Door & Lumber Co. of Grant's Pass, increasing the capital stock to 125,000 dollars. The Carlton Improvement Co., with 4000 dollars, will deal in real estate. Incorporators W. A. Howe, F. S. Cottle and Wm. Heutch, Noah N. Tyner, H. H. Nontrup, F. K. Arnold and W. A. Gilbert capitalize at 300,000 dollars. The Oregon and Washington Bridge Co., for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating a bridge across the Columbia river from La Camas, Wash., to a point on the westerly shore of the Sandy river, Oregon. Articles were filed in the office of the secretary of state Dec. 10.

Articles of incorporation of the Salem, Astoria & Eastern Railway company were filed in the office of the secretary of state December 13. The incorporators are, H. W. Cottle, E. M. Waite, Squire Farrar, Wm. England, H. J. Minthorn, J. H. Albert, J. A. Baker and J. Q. Wilson. The amount of the corporation's capital stock shall be 200,000 dollars, and the amount of each share shall be 10 dollars. The corporation is formed for the purpose of making, constructing, operating, maintaining leasing and selling a railroad between Salem and Astoria, via Tillamook county, and Salem and Mill City. A majority of the board of directors shall reside at Salem.

The Citizen's real estate company of Portland increased its capital from \$50,000 to half a million. A. H. Turner, F. A. Starr, F. E. Hart, L. L. Hawkins, D. W. Taylor, J. W. Hill, S. J. Barber, A. P. Armstrong, J. A. Sladen, J. P. Marshall, Donald Macleay and Geo. H. Williams filed the supplementary articles. Wm. McDonald, Jr., W. R. Smith and Clark Braley, of Astoria, incorporate the Gateway City Real Estate Co., for the purpose of engaging in real estate and fire and marine insurance business. The capital stock is \$2000 and articles were filed Dec. 11.

Salem, Dec. 11, 1889
State of Oregon, respondent, vs. John Buckley, appellant. Appeal from Multnomah county. Judgment reversed and the cause remanded to the lower court for a new trial. Opinion by Strahan, J. Thayer, C. J. concurs. Lord, J. dissent.

Joseph Paquet, appellant, vs. The Mount Tabor Street Railroad company, respondent. Appeal from Multnomah county. Judgment of the lower court affirmed. Opinion by Thayer, C. J. Strahan, J., concurs, Lord, J., dissent.

M. McQuaid, appellant, vs. The Portland and Vancouver Railway company, respondent. Appeal from Multnomah county. Judgment reversed and the cause remanded to the lower court for a new trial. Opinion by Thayer, C. J. Strahan, J., concurs. Lord, J., thinks the case ought to be reversed, but not for the purpose or for the reasons stated in the opinion.
