

Beavs, Pilots coming to Keizer

Keizer's Volcanoes Stadium will host a baseball game between Oregon State University and University of Portland Tuesday, April 14.

Tickets are now available to the general public by calling the Volcanoes Stadium ticket office at 503-390-2225, visiting the Volcanoes website at www.volcanoesbaseball.com, or in person at the Volcanoes Stadium ticket office Monday through Friday 9 a.m. until 5 p.m., Saturdays and Sundays 8 a.m. until noon.

General admission outfield seats are \$10, Reserved seats

are \$15 and theatre-style box seats are \$20. Game time is 6:30 p.m.

The Beavers return junior Jeff Hendrix who received All-Pac-12 First Team honors and was selected in the 39th round of the 2014 MLB First-Year Player Draft by the Kansas City Royals. He played in 46 games and batted .351 with 11 doubles, five triples, two home runs, and 32 RBIs.

Sophomore Logan Ice also returns to the team with All-Pac-12 honorable mention honors. He played in 59

games last season and batted .250 with five doubles and 19 RBIs.

Portland had a record of 11-41 in the 2014 season. The team returns eight position starters and two starting pitchers with 11 newcomers for the 2015 season.

The Pilots return senior Caleb Whalen who had 52 appearances in the 2014 season with a batting average of .265 and 22 RBIs. Senior Cody Lenahan is also on the roster, he played in 50 games and batted .203 with 23 RBIs.

"I thought I could have done better than I did last year, I want to be the best in anything I do now," he said. "I'm more happy than I've ever been."

After beating out their first opponent of the season, the McNary High School varsity baseball team could only muster one hit in a game against West Linn High School on Wednesday, March 18.


The Lions took a 1-0 lead in the first inning on a home run with senior Mickey Walker pitching. In the fifth inning, West Linn got its first player on base with a bunt, another with a walk and a single loaded the bases. Evan Alger came in to relieve Walker, and a ground out led and off-the-mark throw to first put runners at second and third. A walk and a batter hit by a pitch kept the Lions going before a triple notched the final runs of the inning.

Mathew Ismay got the only hit for the Celtics in the top of the fifth, but was caught stealing second.

On Friday, March 20, McNary traveled to meet the Wilsonville High School Wildcats and took a 6-2 win.

A double play in the first inning ended the Celts opportunities and Wilsonville put one on the board in the bottom of the frame with Josiah Gilbert on the mound for McNary.

In the top of the second, Celt Tim Hays drew a walk, then Trevor Gilbert hit a single. Hays scored on an error by the Wildcat pitcher while Gilbert moved to third. Nick Lafontaine made it all the way to second from the plate on the same error. Gilbert and Lafontaine scored on RBIs from Jacob Vasas and Walker. McNary had the lead 4-2
