One of the topics brought up during last month's Keizer Traffic/Bikeways/Pedestrian Safety committee meeting was new laws meant to give more protection to bicyclists along highways in Oregon. The Vulnerable Roadway Users and Safe Passing Distance laws were approved last summer.

Hersch Sangster led the discussion on the topic during the bikeways meeting.

Committee member John Henry Maurice was attending his first meeting since being hit by a vehicle on March 14. Maurice was riding his bike near Antelope in Central Oregon when a motorist hit him, causing serious injuries. Maurice continues to recuperate at his Keizer home.

"The Oregon Legislature passed a law in July that when passing a cyclist you need to leave about three feet," Sangster said. "There has been


