

School Board plans for budget

The recent Oregon Supreme Court decision restoring most Public Employees Retirement System benefits was a concern of Monday's budget committee meeting of the Salem-Keizer School Dis-

Superintendent Kristy Perry said that, although the district's PERS expenses are set for 2015-16, the next budget would involve an estimated \$8 million to \$10 million in additional spending because of

Monday's meeting, while open to the public, did not include questions or comments from the audience. The committee will hear public testimony Monday and Tuesday of next week and if necessary May 20 and 21 as well.

The district has its second successive budget increase. The 2015-16 proposed budget totals \$654,160,402, up from the \$621,356,557 figure for 2014-15.

Monday's meeting was largely a question-and-answer session, with administrators responding to questions from committee members. The first question was which of the 46 proposed additions to the budget would restore cuts made between 2009 and 2014. Perry said the 14 following additions would be restorations:

- Funding for textbooks and other instructional mate-
- Adding classroom teachers to reduce class sizes in middle

schools and high schools.

- Opening the Career and Technical Education Center.
- Increasing numbers of counselors at elementary schools and adding a counselor each at Sprague and West Salem high schools.
- Adding Instructional Support Cadre staffers to address critical student behavior issues.
- Adding funding to replace aging school library collec-
- Increasing library budgets.
- Adding funds for evening supervision at Sprague and West athletic and other activi-
- Increasing the Salem Area Chamber of Commerce contract for the Ready to Learn/ Ready to Work partnership.
- Adding a custodian to each high school.
- Adding classified staff time to elementary school offices.

- Providing transportation for high school athletes after competition.
- · Adding funds for the now-limited supervisor for technology position.
- Adding one full-time equivalent to the classified staff for the professional development office.

In answer to a question of what AVID Excel was, Perry said it was a supplemental middle school program, offered at the district's five Title 1 middle schools, which include Claggett Creek. All the middle schools and high schools in the district, she added, have AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination). AVID's chief executive officer is Sandy Husk, Perry's predecessor as superintendent, who met with Perry before the budget committee meeting.


