



Shiatsu (shee ot' soo) is a Japanese form of massage, which uses acupressure and stretching to tune the body by balancing its flow of energy, called qi (chee). Unobstructed flow of this vital energy is both the cause and effect of good health. Shiatsu is based in Chinese medical theory, which says that the body has
