

## S-K Volcanoes ready to erupt

'The guys are hungry, and they're ready to go after it."

No, Volcanoes Manager Kyle Haines wasn't talking about food Monday. The new manager of the Salem-Keizer Volcanoes was referring to the eagerness his players had to get this season started.

The opening-day roster is almost complete. Haines said a few more players were likely to be suited up for the opener, which began Thursday, at home against Vancouver, after press time.

A few names will be familiar. Pitchers Nick Gonzalez and Armando Paniagua, catcher Fernando Pujadas, shortstop Christian Lichtenthaler and outfielder Shilo McCall were Volcanoes last year.

Haines plans to start with a
