# Volcanoes take series win over Hawks

The first Volcano run came in the third, when a double by Shilo McCall drove in Junior Amion, who had also doubled.

Starting pitcher Grant Watson was removed after 3-1/3 innings, when the bases were full of AquaSox players, but Eric Sim came in and retired the side.

Salem-Keizer bats woke up in the seventh inning and added a run in the eighth, but it wasn't enough.

Enyel De Los Santos, Everett's starting and winning pitcher at 3-0, held the Volcanoes to two runs in his seven innings and had six strikeouts. Joseph Pistorese got his second save of

Great Boise pitching and weak Salem-Keizer hitting brought about this disappointing start to a home series.

The Volcanoes had only five hits, the only one for extra bases a double by Miguel Gomez, Christian Lichtenthaler, a late bloomer with the bat, had two of the hits, raising his batting average to .259.

Hawk starter Colin Welmon went five innings for the win and a 2-4 record. Relievers Matt Meyer and Craig Schlitter each pitched two innings. Luis Pino, the Volcanoes' starter, gave up all five runs in his six innings, but only two runs were earned. His record ran to 3-1 with a 1.38 earned run average.

Boise was helped by an error in the third inning by third baseman Gomez and two fourth-inning errors by shortstop Lichtenthaler. The Hawks made no errors.

# Aug. 29: Volcanoes 2, Boise 0

David Owen became the winning pitcher despite pitching only two-thirds of an inning. Caleb Smith got his seventh save. All four left the game with earned run averages below three.
