Boys soccer battles Vikings to draw

The McNary High School boys varsity soccer team appears to have hit a midseason slump.

After losing their first game in the last contest of the preseason, the Celtics were only able to battle North Salem High School to a 2-2 draw.

"Honestly, we didn't play very well. Defensively, we weren't doing our thing and

we should have had more goals," said Celt Gustavo Villalvazo.

He felt the team should have had a 3-0 lead at the half, but it just didn't pan out.

Villalvazo scored the first goal of match on a penalty kick in the 21st minute. North knotted the game on a goal by Dylan Reirson in the 38th minute and went ahead on a goal by Edwin Ortiz in the 45th minute. Villalvazo struck again in the

52nd minute off an assist by Bryan Keo.

McNary goalkeeper Sebastian Lopez recorded three saves in the outing.

Villalvazo said the team had great leadership from Jorge Garcia, Paulo Reyes and Luis Audelo throughout the week leading up to the game, but when the whistle sounded the Celts still hadn't flushed the loss to Jesuit High School a week before.

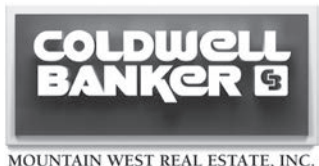
