District crews respond to calls within six minutes more than 90 percent of the time, but call volume is increasing each year and putting more wear and tear on the fleet.

"We need three ambulances to cover the complete 24 days as some vehicles are rotated out of service for repairs and maintenance," Cowan said.

Money raised through the bond approval would pay for five new ambulances, three fire engines, a refurbishment of the current ladder truck, a \$500,000. Cowan said that a refreshed fleet and equipment will take advantage of all the latest technology. For example, new heart monitors will be able to
