

Freshmen lose to Titans

McNary High School's freshman football team fell to West Salem 32-8 Thursday, Oct. 15, at Flesher Field.

The loss puts the young Celtics at 3-3 in the Greater Valley Conference and 3-4 overall.

"We shot ourselves in the foot early with turnovers and just never recovered," said Ted Anagnos, McNary head coach.

West opened the scoring in the first quarter following a fumble recovery at the Celtic three-yard line with a one-yard touchdown run to lead 6-0.

Midway through the second quarter, the Titans blocked a punt and scored on a 14-yard run for a 12-0 lead.

Late in the period, McNary threatened to get back into the game, driving to the West one-yard line. After failing on four tries to score, West was at-

tempting to run the halftime clock out when their quarterback sprung loose for a 95-yard touchdown run with seven seconds remaining to take 19-0 lead into the locker room.

"That run deflated us a bit and I wasn't pleased with the way we responded after the half," said Anagnos.

After the intermission, West scored on a 23-yard run for the only score of the third quarter and a 25-0 lead.

Reserves closed out play in the fourth quarter with West adding to their lead early in the fourth period on a seven-yard run and point after to take a 32-0 lead.

The Celtics avoided a shut-out when quarterback Ryan Bamford threw a 10-yard touchdown pass to receiver Devyn Schurr for a touchdown

with seven seconds remaining in the game. Nigel Harris ran the two-point conversion successfully for the final 32-8 margin.

Quarterback coach George Carter complimented quarterbacks David Allen and Bamford for their play under pressure.

"We didn't block well tonight and they were pressed hard to throw in difficult situations," he said. "They both played well and I was proud of their toughness."

McNary was led on offense by Chantz Revis with 98 yards rushing and Griffin Oliveira with 50 yards receiving.

"Defensively, other than the big run going into the half, we played well," said Nick Phillips, defensive coordinator.

The defense was led by Robert Benson with seven tackles. Linebackers Oliveira and Bo Working added six each. Ty Covalt was credited with four tackles. Schurr, Carson Heldt and Noah Tarter made three each.

Girls soccer loses two

Despite a pair of tough losses last week, the McNary High School girls varsity soccer team managed to keep the good vibes going.

"We haven't let ourselves get down, and a tough loss like the one to Forest Grove would have killed us last year. We wouldn't have recovered," said Brianna Koch, a McNary senior.

McNary hit the field against a seasoned Viking team Tuesday, Oct. 13, and came away with a 7-3 loss.

"It was a tough game and all we could really do was contain them as much as possible so that's what I kept telling the girls," said Janie Jarmin, another Celt senior.

Forest Grove took a 2-0 lead in the first five minutes, but McNary regrouped and clawed their way back into the game with five quick passes on the endline that led to a cross from Kolbie Kopp and a header goal by Jessy Shore in the 12th minute.

While the Viking responded with a goal of their own, McNary didn't let up. In the 18th minute, Michaela Sanchez scored on an assist by Katy Wyatt to make the score 3-2.

The score was 4-2 when Gina Munguia scored from outside the box on a solo shot for the final Celtic goal.

Head coach AJ Nash praised the play of goalkeeper Jazzlyn Lark in the contest and said the team fared as well as anyone could have expected of them given the odds.

"As a team they showed grit and a ton of heart battling back on three separate occasions to stay in the game against a tough Forest Grove team of upperclassmen," Nash said.

The girls also lost a 5-0 contest with West Salem High School Friday, Oct. 16.

"Last year, they would have had five goals in the first half. There was a lot of effort put into the game and we just couldn't get to the net," Koch said.

With two games left in the season, the Lady Celts were seventh in the Greater Valley Conference with a record of 2-4.

"I really just want to see us come out and have fun in the last two games. I want to win if we can, but all of us can still improve," Jarmin said. "We need to work on directed passes and the ground game more than we have been in recent games, that's really our strength and what we know how to do best."

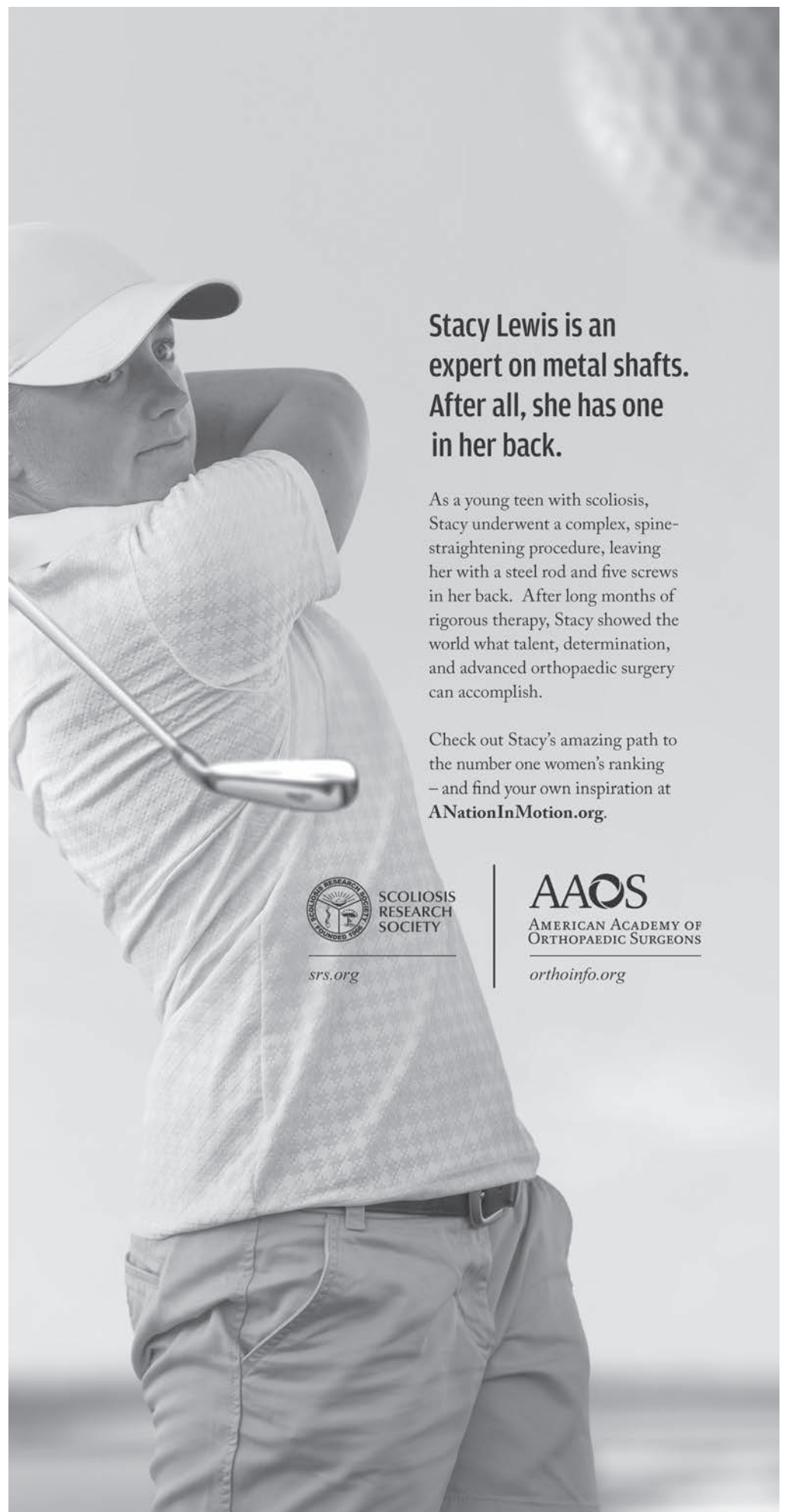
