The same could be said of the last 25 years.


"It's been an incredible ride," Mitchell said.

Walery Plaza is located where River Road and Cherry Avenue meet. If you're driving along River Road on Dec. 1 and can't find it, just look for the tall tree with the




nearby large crowd.
