Joy Beebe, a World War II English war bride and author of Snapshots of a War Bride's Life, as well as a 70-year resident of Keizer, took her Keizertimes to her homeland and the site where her husband was stationed in WWII. The English Tudor home in the background was built in 1537 and housed U.S. Army's Signal Core Unit 6811th Signal Service Detachment (190 men) to operate an intercept station, code named Santa Fe. These 190 GIs deciphered code that was fed to Bletchley Park to help win the war; Carl died in 1995 and never knew what he did to help win the greatest war of America's history.

The outer walls of the Tudor home are a distinctive checkerboard pattern made of flint and rubble, a beautiful example of the masonry style popular in the late 15th and 16th century. Inside, a Great Hall, parlour and great chamber host weddings of today. The home, on 160



acres and is located on the River Cray in Bexley, Kent was originally owned by Sir John Champneys, a wealthy merchant and former Lord Mayor of London.

The gardens at Hall Place were first opened to the public in 1952 by HRH The Duchess of Kent. The famous

topiary at Hall Place, the Queen's Beasts, were planted in 1953 in celebration of the coronation of HM Queen Elizabeth II.

This year Hall Place opened a WWII exhibit, where Joy's wedding dress is on permanent display.


cert Choir and two groups from Chemeketa, the Concert Choir and the Caroling Choir.


