Deja vu for Celtics at North Medford

Just like two years ago, Mc-Nary went to North Medford needing one win to reach the state quarterfinals in Portland and again the Celtics came up short, falling 73-67 on Friday, March 3.

After an even first quarter, the Celtics trailed 28-23

at halftime as they battled through foul trouble with Matthew Ismay, Adam Harvey and Alex Martin all picking up two fouls in the first eight minutes.

With 5:18 remaining in the third quarter, the Celtics got within 32-31 but North Medford answered with a 25-9 run to stretch its lead to 57-40 with 5:49 left in the game.



Ismay 3X Defender of the Year

Earning Greater Valley Conference Defensive Player of the Year was easier for Matthew Ismay in his senior season at McNary, and not because he had already won the award twice.

"When I was a sophomore, everyone was just so much bigger than me," Ismay said. "I would just get bullied down in the post. It's a lot easier now when you're a little bit bigger. It means a lot to me, especially when I was a sophomore I had no idea that I was going to get it but I always pride myself on

defense."

An emphasis on defense is exactly what McNary head coach Ryan Kirch needed when he started turning around the team four years ago.

Ismay consistently guarded the other team's best player.

"It sure makes you look good as a coach," Kirch said. "We always pride our program on being able to defend and rebound. When Matt was a freshman is when we started to turn things around and he's been as influential and he sets the tone for us defensively. He's just a tone setter."
