SKSB locks in plans for meeting student needs

Guidelines for meeting all students' needs were approved at a special Salem-Keizer School Board meeting Tuesday,

The guidelines, known as the Equity Lens, involve board attention to the effects of resource allocation, program development, and support systems. They are designed to assure that decisions provide for each student's needs.

The board committed itself to not letting characteristics such as race, national origin, religion, disability, economic circumstance, mobility, native language, sexual orientation, gender identity, or level of proficiency on entering a school predict or predetermine success.

Changes in resource allocation, design and implementation of policies, and programs will be considered in light of equitable outcomes.

Also at the special meeting, the board approved recommendations by the Citizens Facilities Task Force on seismic preparedness. Michael Wolfe, district chief operating officer, told the board the task force estimated that \$56 million would be the cost of replacing buildings considered to be of very high risk in the event of an earthquake of very high magnitude, and that the total cost for very high-risk buildings and high-risk buildings has been projected at \$151 million.

The board then heard Jay Remy, district communications director, discuss the process of a feasibility study for a general obligation bond to prepare for such an

The budget committee of the Salem-Keizer School District elected Rachel Dewey Thorsett chair and Rick Kimball vice chair for 2017-18.

Dewey Thorsett is a citizen member of the committee, and Kimball is a Salem-Keizer School Board member. The committee consists of the seven board members and seven people from the community. The chair and vice chair positions have traditionally alternated between board and community members.

The next budget committee meeting will be April 25, when Superintendent Christy Perry will deliver the budget message. There will be a question-andanswer session without public testimony May 9, and public testimony is scheduled for May 22 and 23. The committee is scheduled to deliberate the budget May 24 and 25 and make its recommendation May 25. All meetings will be at the Support Services Center, 2575 Commercial St. SE in Salem, at 6 p.m. except the question-and-answer session, which will be at 7 p.m.

Board approval of the budget is expected to be at the board's regular June

The four-class course will run from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday, April 8, Sunday, April 9, Saturday, April 22 and Sunday, April 30. All classes will be held in the community room at the Keizer Fire District at 661 Chemawa Rd. N.E. Students must attend all four of the classes in the course.
