"When I got up, I was just overcome with relief. That was the greatest feeling of the whole night."

Defensive back Alex McGrath then gave McNary fans even more relief, intercepting Grants Pass quarterback Blain Hobbs with only 1:30 left to play.

McGrath said the interception was a team effort.

"They run that hitch (route) a lot so I kind of knew it was coming and Brayden (Ebbs) did a good job setting the edge," McGrath said. "Noah Bach tipped it up and it came right to me and I just tried to get up field. It was just insane and pretty magical."

Walling, who finished with 175 yards on 30 carries, was then able to get a first down and run out the clock.

"That was a huge first down there," Auvinen said. "We just needed one first down and the line, I can't say enough about the job they did. They're getting more belief in each other. The coaches believe in them. We think we can

become that powerful, physical team that we want to be and it starts with the O-line and then our H's are helping in the run game. Our backs are running really well. That was huge."

McNary started the game strong, marching 80 yards on 14 plays to take a 7-0 lead with 7:43 remaining in the first quarter. Walling scored the touchdown on a 12-yard run.

After Grants Pass missed a 34-yard field goal, the Celtics drove inside the Cavemen 5-yard line but weren't able to score, throwing an incomplete pass on fourth-and-goal from the 3.

Grants Pass answered with a 28-yard run directly up the gut of the Celtics defense to tie the game at 7-7 early in the second quarter.

Jacob Jackson then made a 26-yard field goal to give the lead back to McNary, 10-7.

The Celtics had opportunities to get more points before halftime but Williams dropped a wide open touchdown pass. After Jose Solorio made a diving catch to get McNary inside the 10-yard line, Barker threw three consecutive incomplete passes and Jackson then missed a 29-yard field goal wide right.

"We should have 24 if not

28 if not 31 in that first half if we make the plays," Auvinen said. "Our discussion with the offense at halftime was let's finish drives."

Grants Pass took its first lead on a 2-yard touchdown run with 5:58 remaining in the third quarter. The Cavemen then completed a 14-yard touchdown pass to stretch their lead to 20-10 with 2:28 to go.

"I knew they were going to be very tough to beat," Auvinen said. "I knew they were on our level. It's whoever makes the most plays. We made plays when it counted, more than them tonight, only probably a couple, but that's all it takes."

McNary finished with 558 yards of offense.

Barker completed 23 of 38 passes for 337 yards and two touchdowns. McCallister caught three passes for 80 yards. Williams had three receptions for 59 yards and Walling added three catches for 58 yards.

"I thought the kids prepared themselves really well," Auvinen said. "I thought that the kids knew they belonged to be here and it wasn't just a goal to make the playoffs. There have been years when I got that impression. This year, we were ready for a win at home."

The playoff victory was the Celtics first since 2013.

"It's a nice step for us," Auvinen said. "We're going to enjoy tonight. It's been a while."

McNary plays at No. 3 West Linn on Friday, Nov. 11. The defending state champions defeated West Albany 63-13 in the first round

The game-winning score was Montoya's third touchdown of the game. The first came on a 28-yard run to give the Panthers an 8-0 lead with 2:16 remaining in the first quarter.

Rudy Garcia, Claggett's power back, then added a 9-yard touchdown run to stretch the lead to 14-0 with 7:22 remaining in the second quarter.

Long gave Whiteaker a

spark with 5:20 left to play, returning an interception 80 yards for a touchdown.

After CCMS receiver Evan Cornell caught a 55-yard touchdown pass over a Wolverine defender, Long answered with a one-handed grab on the sideline for a 26-yard gain and then broke a tackle for a 7-yard touchdown to get Whiteaker within 20-14 with 10 seconds remaining in the first half.

"Carson is super versa-

tile," Larimer said. "He plays a bunch of different portions and he's been a real leader. He's a great athlete on a team that has a lot of kids that haven't played team sports before and they needed to be led and Carson meant a lot to them, by leading by example and being very positive with them."

Cornell scored a 28-yard touchdown on a reverse and Montoya added a 20-yard touchdown run to stretch Claggett's lead to 32-14.

But Whiteaker kept fighting as Zapien got around the edge of the Panther defense for a 50-yard run and then Long capped the scoring drive with a 1-yard touchdown run to keep the game within reach.

"These kids love each other on this team and it matters when your teammates want you to succeed and you saw it out of these kids, they want it so badly for each other," Larimer said.

After the game, McNary football coaches spoke to players on both teams.

"I hope all these kids keep playing football," Larimer said. "The Claggett kids showed great sportsmanship and I think playing for your school matters and I think it matters for every middle schooler in this district and I'm really grateful for middle school football."

Claggett Creek also won the JV football game earlier in the day, defeating Whiteaker 28-16.
