McNary swimmers win final dual meet

SALEM-Before McNarv senior Grant Biondi's final high school meet at the Kroc Center, head coach Casey Lewin asked him to pick two events he didn't normally swim.

Biondi chose the 200-yard individual medley and 100 butterfly.

That decision paid off as Biondi won the 200 IM in 2:24.75 and 100 fly in 1:06.70 on Tuesday, Jan. 30 against North Salem.

Biondi, who hadn't swam the 200 IM since he was a sophomore, set a personal record in the event by nearly five seconds.

"It was kind of emotional because this is my last meet," Biondi said.

"It was fun to cheer on all my best friends."

Biondi was also motivated to make sure he had a spot on the Celtics district relay teams.

"Our coach made us swim hard this meet because there are a bunch of guys who are like tenths of a second apart," Biondi said. "For our relays, we have to swim out fastest."

"We had a handful of third and fourth varsity spots that were up in the air, especially on the relays," Lewin said. "I have six or seven guys for four spots that really any given day anyone of the guys can step up. I've got some work ahead of me. I'm very pleased."

McNary's boys easily defeated North Salem as a team, 129 - 32.

McNary will compete in the Greater Valley Conference district meet on Feb. 9-10 at the McMinnville Aquatic Center.






