

Chamber hosts ribbon-cutting for new orthodontics office

It can be easy to lose the forest for the trees given the glut of commercials on every television pitching the latest medical treatments for every conceivable ailment. But orthodontist Dr. Jay Schofield has a clear view of his mission.

“Orthodontics can change lives. We do a fair amount of pro bono work and when you have someone with several strikes against them, helping them feel better when they smile can be a small thing that has a big impact,” Schofield said.

Schofield’s newest office, with partner Dr. Stephen Yenne, is located at 5099 River Road N. and it joins a network of five others connecting the two orthodontists with patients and communities from Bend to Dallas. Yenne & Schofield, opened for business about two months ago, but the business held its grand opening with a Keizer Chamber of Commerce ribbon-cutting ceremony on Wednesday, Jan. 24.

The opportunity to open an office in Keizer was brought to the pair by a local realtor.

“The first thing we did was look to see how many patients we had in Keizer and there

were already quite a few here and more in Silverton and surrounding areas who would use a Keizer office,” said Schofield.

Schofield and Yenne offer traditional orthodontic treatments as well as Invisalign treatments and schedule appointments at the office most convenient for their patients. It means that there are no regular business hours, but they are accepting new patients. Call 971-362-0500 to schedule an appointment.

Schofield said they looked at several River Road locations before settling on the former Big-Town Hero spot in Schoolhouse Square.

“One of the things we liked about this space was the windows and parking was important because there is a lot of in-and-out,” Schofield said.

Yenne and Schofield have known each other since they were children attending school a grade apart in Salem and their friendship continued through dental training at Oregon

clinic at the Salem Boys & Girls Club.

The pair wasted little time in becoming an active partner in the Keizer community through the Keizer Chamber of Commerce. Within the first few weeks of opening in November, Yenne & Schofield sponsored the Keizer Christmas Tree Lighting and then served hot chocolate at the office during the Festival of Lights Parade.

“Terri (McCowan), who works in our office, has been a resident of Keizer for a long time and she mentioned the tree lighting and the parade and then doing hot chocolate because we had such a great location,” said Schofield. “We’re happy to get involved with those sorts of things because it’s a connection to the community, but the Keizer community is like no other in terms of how active and cohesive it is.”
