Driver of stolen vehicle leads cop on chase

A man driving a stolen vehicle through south Keizer eventually ended up in handcuffs after attempting to flee a traffic stop.

On Tuesday, Feb. 13, Officer Martin Powell was monitoring traffic on Cherry Avenue Northeast about 11:45 p.m. when he spotted a 1988 Honda Civic with different Oregon license plates on the front and rear of the vehicle.

Powell began tailing the Civic and the driver turned east on Candlewood Drive where Powell attempted to make a traffic stop for the violation regarding license plates. When Powell activated his lights, the driver began to speed away and turned on Brooks Avenue Northeast.

The driver ran the stop sign at Alder Drive Northeast and then went eastbound on Alder which turns into Pleasant View Drive Northeast as you round the corner in front of Ben Miller Park. The vehicle continued south on Pleasant View before turning right and traveling westbound on Shady Lane Northeast. After crossing over the intersection of Brooks Avenue again, and continuing westbound, the driver turned off the headlights, but continued trying to elude Powell as he pursued the car.

The fleeing vehicle continued west on Shady until it reached Cherry Avenue where the driver attempted to make a right turn to travel north, but the Civic nearly collided with another vehicle that was traveling southbound on Cherry Avenue at that time.

The suspect vehicle spun sideways as the driver attempted to negotiate the corner and avoid the other vehicle. After spinning out, the suspect vehicle came to a stop sideways in the northbound lane of travel and the driver exited the vehicle and fled on foot.

The driver fled about one block to the north where he jumped a fence, but was confronted by Officer RJ Farrens who had placed himself in a position to cut off the fleeing suspect.

The suspect was taken into custody and later identified as Jose Urbano, 24, a transient.

Urbano told officers he attempted to flee because he didn't have a driver's license. The vehicle he was driving was reported stolen from the 1000 block of Fir Cone Drive Northeast in Keizer two days prior.

Urbano was taken to the Marion County Correctional Facility and charged with unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, felony attempting to elude a police officer, misdemeanor attempting to elude a police officer, reckless driving, and driving while suspended.

caught up and confronted the suspect knocking him to the ground where he was taken into custody. The driver of the vehicle the suspect tried to enter drove away as the man was taken into custody.

The suspect was later identified as Abel Raymond Nanez, 23, of Salem. He was

arrested and taken to Salem Hospital where he was treated for animal bites and then transported to the Marion County Correctional Facility. He is charged with interfering with a police animal, unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer, misdemeanor fleeing or attempting to elude, reckless driving, reckless endangering, failure to perform the duties of a driver and failure

to appear on a bench warrant. His bail was set at \$55,000.

Nanez was scheduled for arraignment in court Tuesday, Feb. 20.
