# Zielinski gets new trial date

Peter Zielinski, a Keizer man who was convicted of murder in the 2011 shooting death of his wife, Lisa, will be retried for the crime in November.

Zielinski's conviction was overturned last year by the Oregon Court of Appeals. His new trial is set for nine days beginning Nov. 5.

Zielinski was arrested outside the Keizer Police Department in connection with his wife's death on Jan. 12, 2011. Zielinski allegedly used an emergency phone outside the station to request an ambulance for his wife. Lisa was found dead of a gunshot wound to the head in the couple's home.

After previously pleading not guilty to the crime, Zielinski changed his plea to guilty in November 2013 with the condition that he could appeal the conviction. He was sentenced to life in prison with the possibility of parole after 25 years.

In September 2017, the Oregon Court of Appeals overturned the conviction stating that the facts were undisputed, but by not allowing expert testimony that would have cast Zielinski as being under extreme emotional distress and suffering from anxiety disorder, the lower court had overstepped the intent of the law.

"(The) defendant's anxiety disorder, as explained in

this case, bears a closer resemblance to physical illness or disability than it does to non-clinical personality traits like ill temperament, dishonesty, or stubbornness," wrote Judge P.J. Armstrong in the court's opinion.

After his arrest, two psychologists interviewed Zielinski and diagnosed him with anxiety disorder, but the prosecuting attorneys were successful in keeping testimony about Zielinski's anxiety, its source and how it manifests out of the trial. The defense argued that such testimony was critical to understanding Zielinski's situation and might have aided in a defense couched in extreme emotional distress (EED). Determining whether a defendant is operating under such conditions is a question left to

juries. Zielinski has retained Salem-based Noel Grefenson of Storkel & Grefenson as his attorney. Zielinski remains in prison at Oregon State Correctional Institution in Salem. Grefenson declined to comment until the trial is complete.

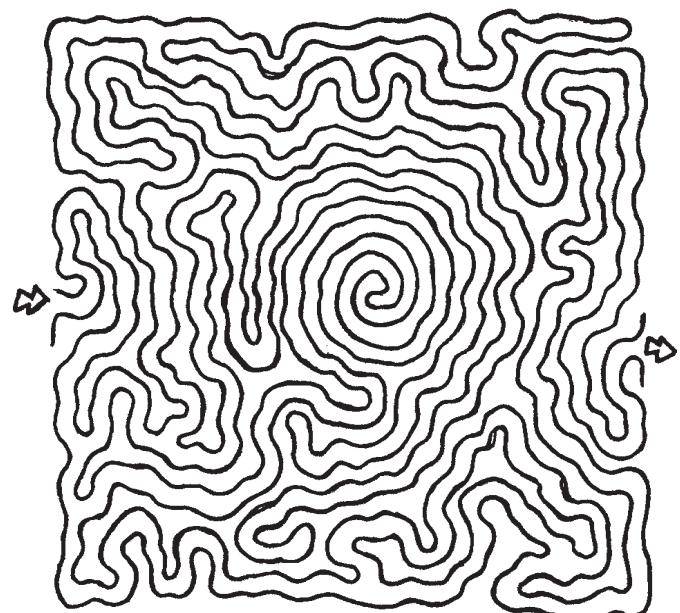
