Continued at JFK Stadium in Philadelphia and at other arenas around the world, the 16-hour “superconcert” was globally linked by satellite to more than a billion viewers in 110 nations. In a triumph of technology and good will, the event raised more than \$125 million in famine relief for Africa.

# Two arrested after rummaging through car

Two females were arrested after allegedly rifling through vehicles at an apartment complex on Monday, July 2, about 9:15 a.m.

The incident occurred in the 600 block of Parkmeadow Loop NE, at the Parkmeadow Apartment complex. The apartment manager called 9-1-1 and reported two women were in a tenant’s vehicle and removing items from it, including a tennis racket and camping chair.

When the manager approached and asked what the women were doing, they said they had just purchased the vehicle and were removing items from it, but they also left shortly afterward in another vehicle.

Dispatchers relayed a description of the suspects’ vehicle to Keizer police who located it near the intersection of River Road North and Shangri-La Avenue Northeast. After running the license plate and discovering the vehicle had been stolen, officers initiated a traffic stop.

Another officer contacted the victim at his apartment who confirmed several items were taken from his vehicle, and other items were taken from his storage unit that was found unlocked nearby. The stolen items totaled more than \$500.

Both the driver and passenger of the stolen vehicle were arrested. Tristen Devore, 30, was charged with theft, burglary, unlawful entry into a motor vehicle and unlawful use of a motor vehicle. A second 17-year-old female was charged with unlawful entry into a motor vehicle, unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, unlawful possession of methamphetamine, second degree theft, third degree theft and burglary.

Both were taken to Marion County Correctional Facility. **MAN ARRESTED AFTER BRIEF FOOT CHASE**

A transient man was arrested near the intersection of River Road North and Greenwood Avenue Northeast on Friday, July 6, about 10 p.m.

While passing through the area on patrol, the arresting officer recognized the suspect as potentially having a warrant for his arrest. While the officer

# Vigil planned for missing woman

A candlelight vigil is being planned for Cynthia Martinez Perez, a Woodburn woman who went missing from a Keizer night club last July.

Friends and family will gather at Chalmers Jones Park behind the Keizer Civic Center, 930 Chemawa Road N.E. The vigil will begin at 7 p.m. Monday, July 16, and last until sunset. Anyone is welcome to attend.

Martinez Perez, a mother of four, disappeared after leaving Tequila Nights Bar and Grill about 2:30 a.m. on July 16, 2017 She had spent the night out with friends celebrating her birthday. Martinez Perez would have celebrated her 27th birthday on Friday, July 13.

In addition to a Crime Stoppers of Oregon reward of up to \$2,500, the Federal Bureau of Investigation is now offering a reward of up to \$8,000 for information leading to the disappearance of Martinez Perez.

Martinez Perez is Hispanic, 5-foot-3, with long black hair and multiple tattoos. Two on her chest read “Dominguez” and “Trust No One.”

The Keizer Police Department is asking anyone who may have information about the disappearance of Martinez to please come forward. Those who wish to remain anonymous

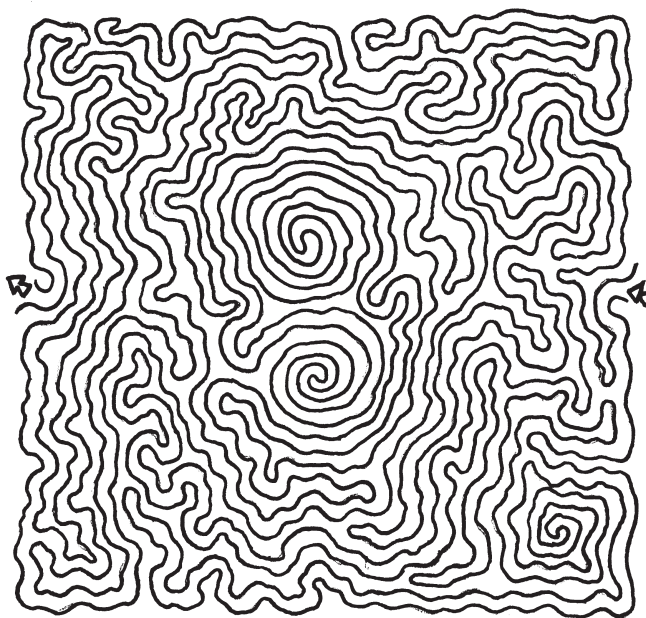
### 15 YEARS AGO
