Volcanoes fall to Hillsboro

The Volcanoes never overcame a 5-0 early Hillsboro lead in the opening game of a home series and came out on the short end of a 6-4 score on Friday, Aug. 17.

Miguel Figueroa, Salem-Keizer's starting pitcher, got through the first inning with one baserunner who didn't get past first base, but the Hops scored two runs off him in the second inning and three in the third. He became the losing pitcher with a 1-4 record.

In the top of the second, Joey Rose led off with a single to left field, and Francis Martinez drove him in with a double to center. A passed ball by catcher Joey Bart moved him to third, and a ground out by Dan Swain scored Martinez.

Jake McCarthy led off the Hillsboro third with a double

to right center.

Walks to Jorge Perez and LT Tolbert loaded the bases. An errant throw by first baseman Robinson Medrano allowed McCarthy to score. Rose, on a 3-2 count, hit a sacrifice fly to center that scored Perez. Tolbert got home on an infield single by Martinez.

With still only one out, JJ Santa Cruz replaced Figueroa on the mound and retired the side on a double play.

The first Volcano run came in the bottom of the third. Jett Manning doubled to right center, and Kyle McPherson brought him home with a double to center.

In the Volcano fourth, David Villar led off with a double to right center. Aaron Bond singled to right, moving Villar to third. A wild pitch from Hops starter Ryan Weiss put Bond on second. Nick Hill

drove Villar in by grounding out. Manning drove Bond in with a single to right center. Kenny Hernandez relieved Weiss and got one more out to retire the side.

Hillsboro added a run in the fifth. Perez led off with a walk. Tolbert and Andy Yerzy reached first on force outs. Rose doubled down the right field line, moving Yerzy to third. Martinez scored Yerzy with a infield single.

In the Volcano fifth, Bart hit a bases-empty home run over the right field fence.

Pitching took over the rest of the way. Matt Frisbee pitched the seventh and eighth for the Volcanoes and Trevor Horn the ninth. Cristofer Ogando took over from Hernandez to start the bottom of the eighth, and Chester Pimentel pitched the ninth.

Hernandez was the win-

ning pitcher with a 5-3 record, and Pimentel had his fourth save.

Thomas and Warner were both GVC All-League honorable mention selections last season.

"I have several returning players who started most of last year and players that are new to varsity were leaders

on our JV team. I know we have the leadership that's required for successful season," DeMello said. "All of them are competitors and I expect them to challenge each other every day in practice."

McNary has 42 girls in its volleyball program, 14 on each team—varsity, JV and freshman.

Dividing up the three teams wasn't easy.

"It was a long tryout," DeMello said. "We're carrying the largest squad that we can at every single level because tryouts were extremely competitive."

"They know each player has skills we need as a team, each player is key to pushing our limits. They have to compete every time they step on the court or their spot is in

jeopardy. It creates competition and that is always good."

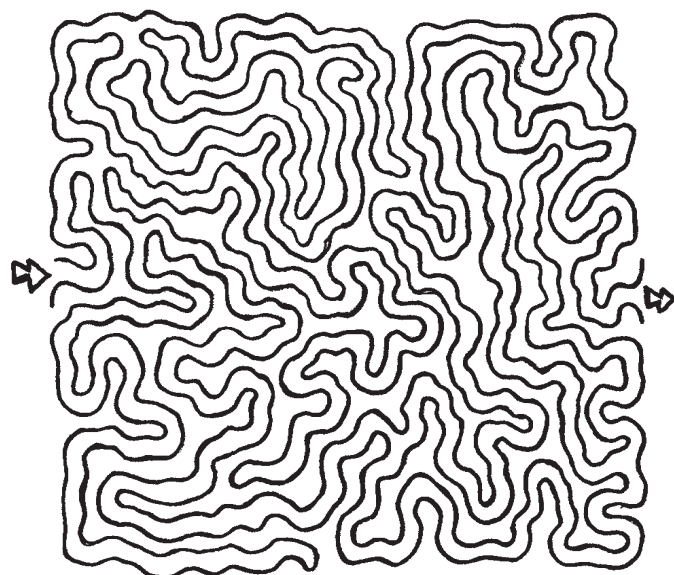
Playing in the new Mountain Valley Conference, the Lady Celts will be tested early.

"They're very competitive and strong," DeMello said. "It doesn't matter that they're coming from 5A. They are strong programs. It will be good for the girls to start the season with them. We are looking forward to it."
