## Lady Celts rout Vikings 4-0

McNary had not beaten Forest Grove in the past four seasons and hadn't even scored on the Vikings in the past two.

Senior Abbie Hawley put an end to that, putting two balls in the back of the net, as the Lady Celts ran away with a 4-0 victory on Thursday, Aug. 30.

"I was just trying to be aggressive and I knew I could push myself and get a little faster and just get past them," Hawley said of her two goals which came in the 35th and 45th minute.

McNary came in confident after getting a 2-1 win against a physical South Medford squad just two days prior.

"I think coming back from South Medford, they were really aggressive and they kind of pushed us to our limit," Hawley

said. "So I think we brought back that intensity that they gave us to our home field and we just came out and knew that we had to play aggressive against this team, too."

Senior Katy Wyatt assisted on McNary's first three goals. The first started with a Hawley corner kick, which Julie Dieker finished to give the Lady Celts a quick 1-0 lead.

The final goal came from McNary's second team as Caitlyn Yates gave the Lady Celts a 4-0 lead with 11 minutes left to play.

"Our depth is as strong as it's ever been in my 10 years here, which means when we put

seven starters on the bench and put seven people off the bench in the game like we did, we didn't drop in play or intensity," McNary head coach A.J. Nash said.

With games still to come against Sheldon (Sept. 11), Lake Oswego (Sept. 13) and Lincoln (Sept. 18), the Lady Celts are in the midst of playing their toughest schedule in years, maybe

ever. "We're trying to keep our expectations just on that next game and not get too far in front of us because we don't have any easy games," Nash said. The girls are looking forward to playing some of the best teams in the state.

"The team is really embracing that and we're encouraging each other to do the best we can do," Hawley said.

# Volcanoes fall to Hops, miss playoffs

The Volcanoes ended their season Sunday with a 5-4 loss to the Hillsboro Hops, who are in first place in the Northwest League's Southern Division.

It meant a 2-1 road series loss after a lead that lasted until the bottom of the sixth inning, and even then it was a 4-4 tie. Hillsboro scored the final run in the eighth. Salem-Keizer had a lineup of mostly reserves.

Unlike the Hops, the Volcanoes will not get into the playoffs. A win by the Eugene Emeralds on Saturday eliminated Salem-Keizer.

The first run was scored by Hillsboro in the first inning. Jake McCarthy hit a leadoff home run to right field.

Salem-Keizer answered with two runs in the top of the fourth. Wander Franco led off with an infield single and went to second base as Dalton Combs singled to left. Two outs followed. Victor Cairo, usually a bullpen catcher but the designated hitter, drove in both runners with a single to right.

In the Hillsboro second, William Gorman tied the

score with a homer to right.

The Volcanoes went up by two in the top of the fourth. Franco doubled to right, and Combs homered to right. Wesley Rodriguez relieved Hops starter Yelson Santana.

With two out in the Hops fifth, Keshawn Lynch doubled to left and went to third on a wild pitch by starter Gregory Santos. Dan Swain hit an infield single, scoring Lynch.

Greg Jacknewitz relieved Santos to start the sixth. Ryan January hit an infield single, and Joey Rose drove him in with a double to left. With two out in the bottom of the sixth, Justin Garcia relieved Rodriguez.

Zach Becherer pitched the Hops seventh and allowed no runs and one walk. Trevor Horn pitched the eighth and gave up a leadoff home run to left to David Garza Jr.

Trevor Garcia pitched the ninth for Hillsboro and retired the side in order. He became the winning pitcher with a 3-1 record. Horn was the loser at 0-1.

The defensive highlight of the game, at least for the Volcanoes, was catcher Ricardo Genoves's throwing, which thwarted five base-stealing attempts. Genoves, who was hitless in his first six games and had a long time reaching a .200 batting average, also had two hits in the game and ended up at .243.
