Council adopts 5-year park plan

The Keizer City Council approved a five-year plan for the city's 19 parks at its meeting Tuesday, Jan. 22.

The plan, approved earlier in the month by the Keizer Parks Advisory Board, includes several sought-after improvements and replacements beginning with the 2020 fiscal year.

Up first are updates at Carlson Skate Park that will lead to better transitions for park users and a sport court replacement at Willamette Manor Park in southwest Keizer. Other first-year projects include replacing a swing set at Northview Park, replacing a 19-year-old truck and tree work throughout the system. The Keizer parks

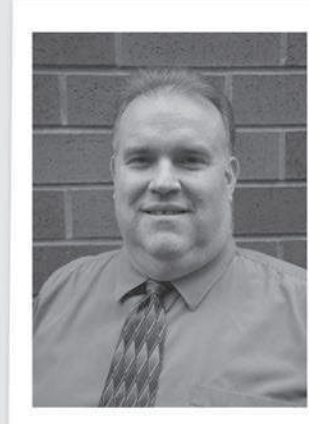
department has enough of a backlog in tree maintenance or removal that it appears throughout the working plan for the first four years.

The remaining four years of the plan includes:

- Fiscal year 2020-21
 - Replace Northview Park stairs
 - Install two new picnic structures near Big Toy
 - Demolish the Charge home and install gravel pad for food trucks at Keizer Rapids
 - Power and water for food truck pads in Keizer Rapids
 - Resurface and expand north parking lot at Claggett Creek
 - Repair backstops/fences

- Master Plan and SDC methodology update
- Tree work systemwide
- Fiscal year 2021-22
 - New pathway lighting at Bair Park and additional lighting at Country Glen Park
 - Create equipment access to lower portion of Wallace House
 - Replace Claggett Creek Park play structure
 - Paint gazebo at Chalmers Park
 - Tree work systemwide
 - Replace a Kubota tractor
- Fiscal year 2022-23
 - Install picnic shelter by the river at Keizer Rapids
 - Replace play structure at Bob Newton Park
 - Expand trail/road to boat-in campsite in Keizer Rapids
 - Replace play structure at Ben Miller Park
 - Tree work systemwide
- Fiscal year 2023-24
 - New sports court at Keizer Rapids
 - Expand parking lot by dog park at Keizer Rapids
 - Replace two zero-turn mowers

The Oregon State Capitol Foundation will celebrate Oregon's 160th birthday on Saturday, Feb. 16, between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m.

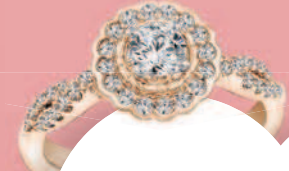
Visitors can pound an anvil, have a conversation with Dr. John McLoughlin as you arrive off the Oregon Trail, help build a log cabin, learn about the Native peoples of Oregon, and test their knowledge and skills at many other stations. All activities are free to the public.

There will be music, costumed historic interpreters, games, free birthday cake, a pioneer wagon, a stagecoach, and photo opportunities.

The Oregon State Constitution will be on display in the West Galleria and members of State Archives will be on hand to discuss the document and its history.

Statehood day is February 14, but in order to open the building and give access to the public on a weekend, the birthday is celebrated on the closest Saturday to the actual day of statehood.
