

Historic romance on display at local museums through April

The Willamette Heritage Center in conjunction with nine regional museums and historical societies is presenting *Romance: Stories of Love and Passion in the Mid-Willamette Valley* including the Keizur family wedding socks. The exhibit runs through April 20 at the Mission Mill in Salem.



Submitted Among the exhibits featuring footwear in area museums is a pair of wedding socks worn by a members of the Keizur family in North Carolina and, later, by some of Oregon's pioneers.

The exhibit consists of small displays curated by a variety of heritage organizations from across the region. They share their stories, research and artifacts based upon a unifying theme. It is a way to look at an historical topic through a variety of perspectives and lenses.

The Keizer Heritage Museum's display includes the wedding socks Mary Gurley Keizur made for her husband, Thomas Dave Keizur, while they lived in their native North Carolina. A Keizur son, grandson and a great-grandson wore the

same socks on their respective wedding days. The socks were donated to the Oregon Historical Society in 1903. Willamette Heritage Center hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday. Admission is \$8 for adults, \$7

for those 65 and over, \$5 for students with school ID, \$4 for youth (6-17) and free for those age 5 and under. The Center is at Mission Mill at 500 13th St. SE in Salem. For information visit willametteheritage.org.

City manager gets power to remove public property stragglers

Keizer's city manager has a new tool to deploy when people overstay their welcome on public property.

The Keizer City Council adopted a resolution granting the city manager authority to order the removal of people who don't move along when asked.

"There has been an increase in the number of people staying in parks after hours. Occa-

sionally, we have folks that are a little more resistant," said Shannon Johnson, Keizer's city attorney. "Typically, we give them some time to move on after a warning and then issue a citation, but citations have a limited effect."

Johnson said that the city manager would typically be the person charged with making the order to remove someone from public property, but he wanted to make it explicit in city policy.

"We wanted to put this in place so that we can't be questioned on having the authority to do so," Johnson said. "It gives our police a path to get permission to remove someone."

The resolution includes the authority to issue standing orders regarding specific times and locations when public property is off limits and order removal when any applicable laws are violated.

After the meeting, Johnson clarified that the need arose out of growing concerns at Keizer Rapids Park and the focal point at the intersection of Chemawa Road and River Road.

"Most people are cooperative; this is for just a few who are not," Johnson said.
