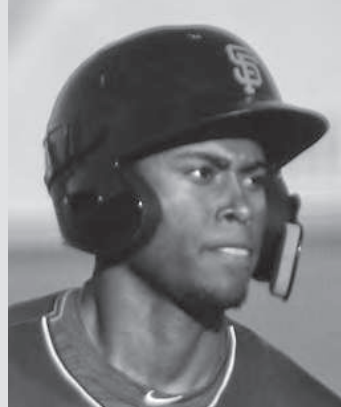


ALEXANDER CANARIO OF, Salem-Keizer Volcanoes
