

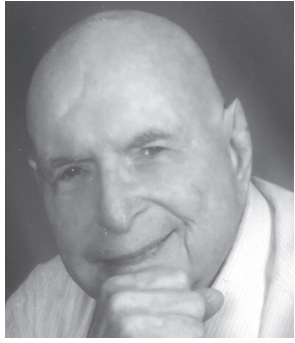

Charles Wallace Shirley

March 8, 1927 – July 25, 2019

Charles "Chuck" Shirley went to be with the Lord peacefully on July 25. He was born in Detroit, Mich., on March 8, 1927 and died July 25, 2019 at his home in Keizer, Ore., surrounded by loved ones.

Chuck met his first wife, Marna, in Detroit, MI at Highland Park High School in June 1943, when he returned from Mississippi, to the area where he had grown up. They planned their church wedding the day after her high school prom, June 10, 1945. After he completed his 20-month inducted U.S. Army service in Jan. 1947, they moved to Rochester, NY.

In early 1951, they moved to Santa Rosa, Calif., with their children, 3-year-old Karen Ann, and 1-year-old David Charles. That was the beginning of a wonderful 40 year stay in the central California area. Chuck's start in banking led them from Santa Rosa, to Napa and Seaside (Monterey Peninsula area).

In 1974, they bought a block in an old mining town in Coulterville, Calif., near Yosemite National Park. Chuck was hired as Mariposa County Assessor's Office north side property tax appraiser and spent 13 years there until his retirement in 1990. Chuck served as a volunteer firefighter from 1974 to 1991 and was recognized in 2000 for his work with the Coulterville Fire Brigade.

Over the years of marriage, Marna and Chuck visited all 50 states of the country and spent two weeks sailing the warm waters of the Virgin Islands. After retirement, they celebrated their 50th anniversary on a 14-day, eight country, tour of Western Europe.

Chuck met his 2nd wife Patricia "Patty" Shirley (Beard) in 2012 in Keizer. They were married July 22, 2014, in a small ceremony with good friends in Reno, Nevada.

Chuck was an avid bowler from age 16. Patty shared Chuck's love of bowling and they met many great friends while bowling together. They took many trips and traveled across country on more than one occasion. In 2012, Chuck and Patty traveled to Sault

Saint Marie, Mich., where they toured the Valley Camp Museum, once a ship, known as Louis W. Hill, that Chuck sailed on the Great Lakes while in the Merchant Marines.

Chuck was involved in many churches, fraternal and service clubs, and charitable and community building projects over the years.

Chuck will be missed by his loving wife Patty, his family, relatives and friends across the country. He was dearly loved by everyone. He was preceded in death by son David and daughter Karen and first wife Marna. He's survived by his loving wife Patty, granddaughter Sharon Lewis-Hahn, in Newport, Ore., and grandsons David Hahn and Charles Hahn in Susanville, Calif., and seven great grandchildren.

A Celebration of Life will be held at 11 a.m., Saturday,

Aug. 17, at the First Christian Church, 685 Marion St., NE, Salem. He will be interred in the Willamette National Cemetery in Portland.

Drop off school supplies at newspaper's office

The Salem-Keizer Education Foundation (SKEF) is collecting school supplies to stock the School Supply Depot to assure every student has the basic tools they need to succeed in class. The Keizertimes office at 142 Chemawa Road N. is a drop off site.

The School Supply Depot is a resource open to every school, classroom, student program and child in the district which serves 43,000 students in more than 66 schools. According to SKEF, 70 percent of Salem-Keizer children are considered to be living in poverty.

The top requested items are composition notebooks, dry erase pens, scientific calculators, baby wipes, colored pencils, facial tissue, graph paper, notebook paper, scissors, Sharpies and tape. The foundation cannot distribute hand sanitizer to students.

The school supply drive will continue to through Aug. 29. The Keizertimes office is open Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Holocaust survivor speaks at Willamette U.

Jona Laks, a Jewish Holocaust survivor will speak at Willamette University on Monday, Aug. 12.

Laks was subject to human experimentation by Josef Mengele at the Auschwitz concentration camp. She and her sister Miriam were moved to the camp after Mengele realized they were twins. They were both experimented on until their liberation. After World War II Ms. Laks founded the Organization of Mengele Twins.

Rabbi Avrohom Perlstein

of Salem's Chabad Center for Jewish Life, which is sponsoring the event with local business, said "This is a rare opportunity to come face to face with history."

"Jona is one of 1,500 sets of twins that were used for human experiments," Perlstein continued.
