

Audition for Pentacle's Orient Express production

The lobby doors open at 12:30 p.m. and open auditions for all roles begin promptly at 1 p.m. Plan to arrive early to complete

an audition form. Downloading a copy and filling it out in advance is encouraged, visit PentacleTheatre.org/auditions.

Headshots and resumes are not required, but always appreciated. Actors will audition by reading selected scenes from the script.

Rehearsals will generally be from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays, beginning on Oct. 28.

21-year-old cops to exposing himself in Safeway parking lot

A 21-year-old Keizer resident was arrested for public indecency in the parking lot at Keizer's Safeway location Wednesday, Oct. 2.

At approximately 9:45 a.m., Keizer police officers were dispatched to the parking lot of the Safeway grocery store at 4990 River Road North to a report of a man exposing himself to passersby while standing outside his black Chevrolet Blazer.

Responding officers spoke with a witness and, based upon

their investigation, arrested Lizzandro Garcia-Guzman for public indecency.

In a Facebook post to the Salem/Keizer Crime page, a woman reported spotting the suspect following her around the store. He reportedly did not stop the harassing behavior until she spoke with a store employee about his presence.

Later in the same discussion

thread, another woman reported suspicious behavior and said she drove by his vehicle to take a picture of his license plate. As she did, the man was allegedly masturbating outside his vehicle.

In a subsequent interview with Keizer police department detectives, Garcia-Guzman admitted to exposing himself at the same location on two previous occasions, September 26 and 29.

Garcia-Guzman was booked into the Marion County jail and later released. Anyone with information is asked to contact Det. Ben Howden at 503-856-3525.

Man arrested in stranger's home after eluding cops

Jacob Michael Brown, 28, was arrested on the afternoon of Sunday, Oct. 6 and faces charges of extortion fourth-degree assault, strangulation and menacing.

On the evening prior, Marion County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to a domestic disturbance around 11 p.m. Saturday on Elma Drive SE in Salem. Deputies developed probable cause to arrest Brown, a Keizer resident.

Keizer Police officers attempted to take Brown into custody in the 1700 block of Wildwood Place Northeast Sunday, but Brown was able to get away on foot and was believed to be armed with a pistol — according to Commander Jeffery Stutrud with

the sheriff's office.

The following day, Keizer officers responded to a burglary in progress at 4385 Verda Lane NE. According to Sgt. Bob Trump, further investigation showed that after hiding in the brush to the

west of Verda, Brown entered 4385 Verda through an unlocked back door. While inside the Verda address, he ate food from the refrigerator. When the homeowner came home through the front door, Brown fled out the back door and

jumped over a fence, into the backyard of 4375 Verda Lane, where he was confronted by the homeowner.

From there, the suspect walked to a nearby garage sale and was seen by a responding officer milling around clothing that was for sale. When additional officers arrived,

the resident hosting the garage sale told them Brown selected clothing and asked to step inside their home to try on the clothes. Officers met up with Brown, just inside the door of that home, and arrested him without incident. He was booked into Marion County jail.
