A memorial is planned for April 4, 2020, honoring both Ray and Louise. A big thank you is extended to everyone at The Arbor Memory Care for the endless kindness.



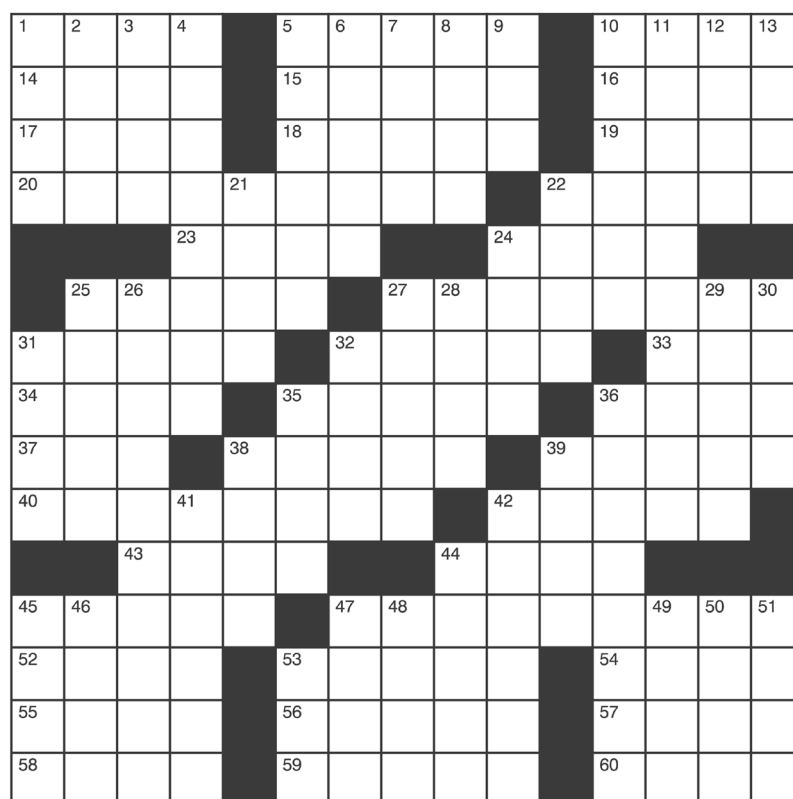
