a free suicide prevention training, Question, Persuade and Refer (QPR) session at Claggett Creek Middle School,1810 Alder Dr. N.E. at 5:30 p.m.

Throughout February and March, Salem Health and SKPS are partnering to provide QPR training, a simple process that anyone 14 years of age and older can be trained to use to help save the life of a person who is in crisis.

During each training session, attendees will learn: myths and facts about suicide, how to recognize signs someone may be thinking about suicide, how to ask questions to assess the

and how to refer them to a professional for help to get them through the crisis and treat any underlying mental illness.

Events will be held in English or Spanish and free dinner and childcare will be provided, with the exception of the student session on March 3. Due to the format of the training, translation services will not be offered.
