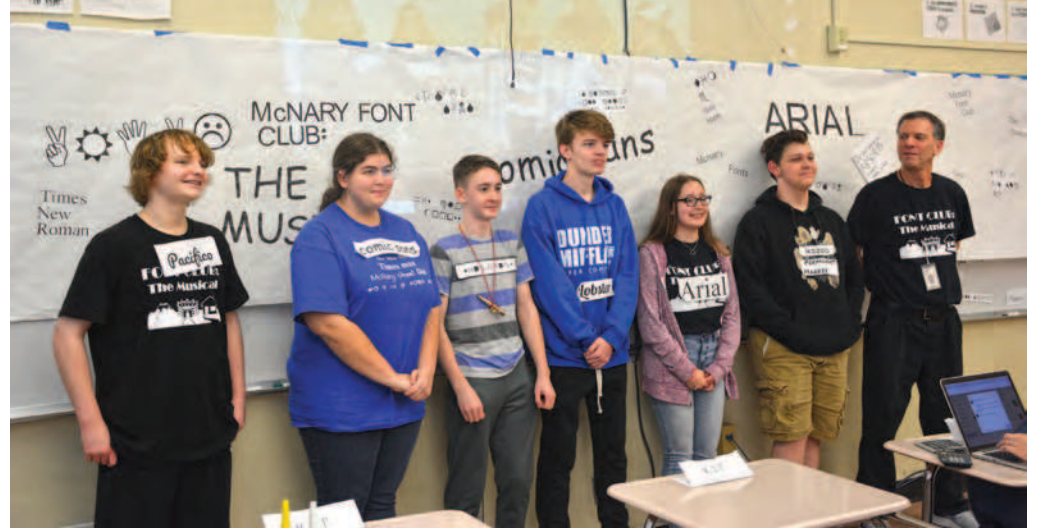
It was free to enter, but \$5 to leave. If attendees tried to escape without paying, the ticket-checker was wearing roller skates to chase them down.
