



# Art association awards Orange show standouts

*Single Step*, a mixed media piece by Jami Faith, took Best of Show honors in the Keizer Art Association's April virtual show.

Faith's piece depicts a pair of feet, composed of bits of maps, stepping through flower petals (pictured left).

"The use of a world map for the feet makes the viewer wonder where the walker is and where the feet will go," judges wrote in awarding the artist.

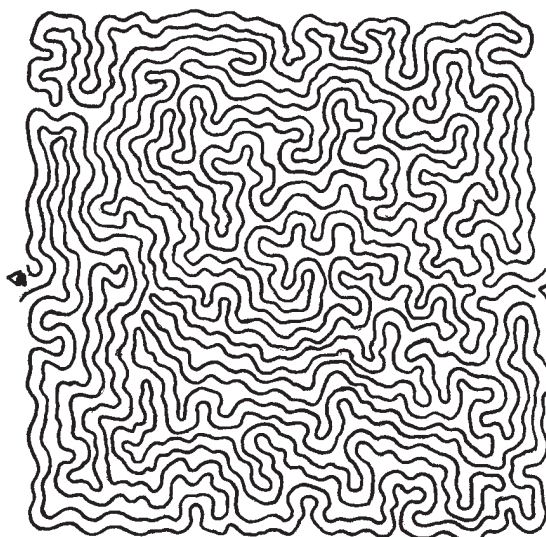
