shots-on-goal in the first 13 minutes of the half, but still couldn't break the seal.

Despite playing with an extra man in the back, the Tigers were able to push numbers forward to score their third goal on a header by Henry Murray.

However, the Celtics finally responded to score their first goal of the game in the 67th minute. McNary was awarded a penalty kick after a Newberg defender was called for a hand-ball inside the goalie box, and Celtics forward Hudson Brunk took advantage of the gift, torching the right side of the net with a goal to put McNary within two.

Just over four minutes later, the Celtics got on the board again as Brunk sent a beautiful cross over the goalie's head that landed just a couple feet away from the net. Jorge Ruiz was able to get the touch on the ball and convert on the point-blank goal to cut Newberg's lead to 3-2.

Camarena said the key to McNary's offensive surge was changing their formation from a 3-5-2 to a 4-3-3.

"We were able to attack more. It worked when we changed strategy. But it wasn't enough to come all the way back," Camarena said.

McNary had two more cracks at a goal to force a draw in the final three minutes, but couldn't get off a clean look.

McNary will host Crescent Valley in their final non-conference game on Friday, Sept. 24 at 4:30 p.m.
