making around this and we'll take it in a thoughtful and deliberate way."

COVID cases within Salem-Keizer schools have fallen in recent weeks after peaking in early January. For the week ending on Jan. 22, 712 students and staff contracted COVID in Salem-Keizer schools. Last week, that number dropped to 61 students and staff.

While the rally was advertised as being "not political and not anti-mask,"

it was widely advertised on the social media pages of groups such as Timber Unity and FreeOregon, an active anti-vaccine and anti-mask group.

Angela Todd, the chief communications officer for FreeOregon, said the group helped put the word out for the rally. She said that even with the OHA announcement yesterday, there are no "guarantees" the mask mandate will be lifted
