

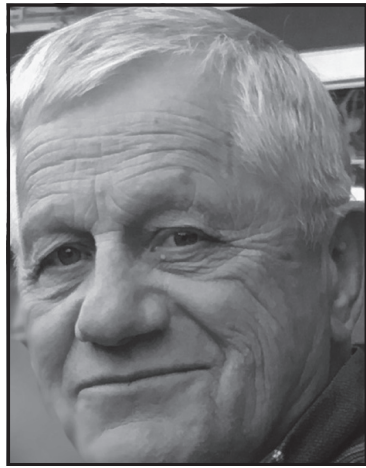

Norman Paul Hellbusch

Norman Paul Hellbusch was born Sep. 5, 1941 to Arthur J. Hellbusch and Ethel V. Hellbusch (Lenaburg) in Watertown, S. Dak. He passed away at the age of 80, surrounded by his family, after a short battle with Cancer.

Norm graduated from Watertown High School in 1959 and was a member of the Arrows state championship team that year. If you met him, you most likely met a friend, and trips to South Dakota were always cherished. Moving to Oregon in 1960 he soon found Salem Golf Course. It was there where many friendships were made and competitions won. He also maintained his love of sports on the softball diamond and on the basketball courts up and down I-5.
