Keizer Public Works department is installing new water lines in residential neighborhoods. For the next two months, residents of Joan Dr., Chehalis Dr., Newberg Dr. and Orchard St. may experience commuting delays as a result of the construction. The city has contracted with Trench Line Excavation for some of the work, while city workers handle the line installation.

According to the Keizer's Water Master Plan, the city's average daily water demand is expected to rise to 5.3 million gallons per day by 2023, from its current level of 3.5 million per day.

The city currently derives all its water from groundwater sources including wells that tap into the Wilamette Silts and the Troutdale Aquifer. Due to this, recent modifications to the federal Safe Drinking Water Act will have little to no impact on Keizer.

If you want to get to know people, help fill a need, and get connected more in your community, then sign up to help out.

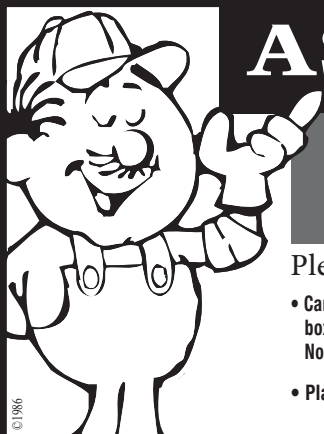

- Plastic Bottles and Jugs Only - NO bags, tubs, clamshells, bubble Pak, or other plastics.

A. Be very careful to only recycle the things on your hauler's approved list.

NOTE: PLASTIC BAGS, STYROFOAM, & WAXY CARTONS WERE NEVER RECYCLABLE!
