

Veterans Administration Announces Educational Program

Veterans now receiving domiciliary care in Veterans Administration facilities, and who are also eligible for education or vocational rehabilitation under either Public Law 346 or Public Law 16, 78th Congress, may take such training and still receive domiciliary care, Brig. Gen. Frank T. Hines, Administrator of Veterans' Affairs, said today.

General Hines ruled that a veteran receiving vocational training or education under either law while in a domiciliary home is not receiving duplicate benefits, which is prevented by law.

The ruling called attention, however, to the fact that increased pensions as provided in Public Law 16 and monetary subsistence

allowances granted in Public Law 346 may not be paid, as the veteran is already receiving subsistence in the facility and with such payment would be receiving duplicate benefits.

Veterans receiving training or education under either law may be admitted to domiciliary homes, provided they meet the requirements for care—that they possess a chronic disablement of such degree and probable persistency as to incapacitate the veteran for earning a livelihood for a prospective period.

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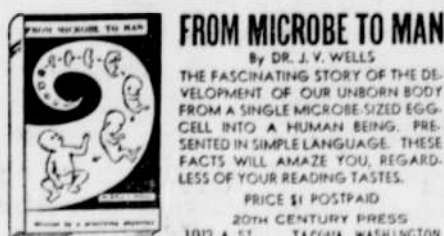
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
