A NEW DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE FOR THE RACES OF MANKIND

Last week in San Francisco, California, fifty some odd nations signed "THE CHARTER", enumerating a "NEW DECLARATION OF INDEPENDDENCE" for the races of mankind, united in a common cause-victory over axis aggression, the military destruction of fascism.

This heterogeneous group of United Nations include the most different physical types of men, the most unlike beliefs, the most varied ways of life.

Caucasions, yellow men, black men and so called "red men" of America, inhabitants of the tropics and of the artic, from East to West, joined in signing the document which is supposed to be the pattern to establish permanent peace.

This titanic struggle; this long and bloody war for the first time has brought home to us here in the United States the fact that the whole world has been made One Neighborhood. All races of man is shoulder to shoulder.

Our armed forces are in Germany, Italy, Africa, The Solomones, Australia, The Philippines, and other parts of the world.

This is not a new experience to us as it is to the people of other nations.

In the United tates men of different color, hair, and head shape have lived together since the incipiency of our nation.

They are all citizens of this Republic-Chinese, whites, Indians, Negroes, Mexicans and peoples from Europe are subject to all laws of the land.

The story of Adam and Eve told centuries ago the same story that is being exhibited today-to-wit; that all people of the earth are a single family and have a common origin.

We learn from history that progress in civilization is not the monopoly of any race or subrace.

When our white forebearers in Europe were rude stone age primitives the civilization of black men, The Babylonians, The Ethiopians, The Egyptians had already flourished

When Europe was just emerging from the Middle Ages, Marco Polo visited China and found there a great civil-

Black men built the Pyramids and gave to the world the first heiroglyphics. There was then not a question of a Superior or Inferior race as exists today. Then there was no race prejudice.

Yet, even now, notwithstanding the signing of the Charter by all the nations, as aforesaid, we are all aware that the same old story exhists here—that race prejudice still exhists in America.

The one thing that delegates from foreign countries could not understand when they reached America was why "This Race Prejudice."

They ask the question-"Why do you practice discrimination when we are trying to bring about "The True Brotherhood of Man"?

We who are living in these troubled times in this continent can tell them why.

Today weak nations are afraid of the strong nationsthe poor are afraid of the rich; conflict grows fat on fear. Freedom from fear is the way to cure race prejudice.

During the two months the conference was in session in 'Frisco the delegates from America were on the anxious seat; they feared Russia and didn't want to "rub the fur the wrong way". Why? Because for a generation the Russian nation has shown what can be done to outlaw prejudice in a country with many kind of people. They made racial discrimination and persecution illegal. They welcome cultural differences and they refused to treat them as inferiorities.

Russia insisted, and still insists, on "equality for all". They want the charter to be a document which will be
