

## Samarra-Mills Battle to Draw

Seelie Samarra, the popular Northwest Heavyweight Wrestling Champion and the titled English Wrestler, Lord Albert Mills literally fought to a draw in the main event at the Auditorium on Wednesday night. After wrestling for 35 minutes of a scheduled one hour bout, Samarra gained the first fall with a flying toe hold. The titled Englishman was anything but a gentleman during the entire bout and won the second fall to even the score in 7½ minutes.

The next few minutes of the bout it was hard to tell whether it was a wrestling or a boxing match as the two wrestlers went at each other with lefts and rights. This melee was started by Mills, but the referee stopped the bout calling it a draw.

Next week's bout will find Seelie facing the winner of last Wednesday's semi-final match, Perri DeGlane in a one hour, 2 out of 3 falls match, DeGlane having publicly challenged the winner of the Samarra vs. Mills match. On the same card, Lord Alb. Mills will meet the wily and tough Rube Wright in the second half of the double main event, and Lew Neumann will meet Fritz Schnoble in a one fall thirty minute special event.

Doors are open at 8:20 and service men and women are always admitted free.

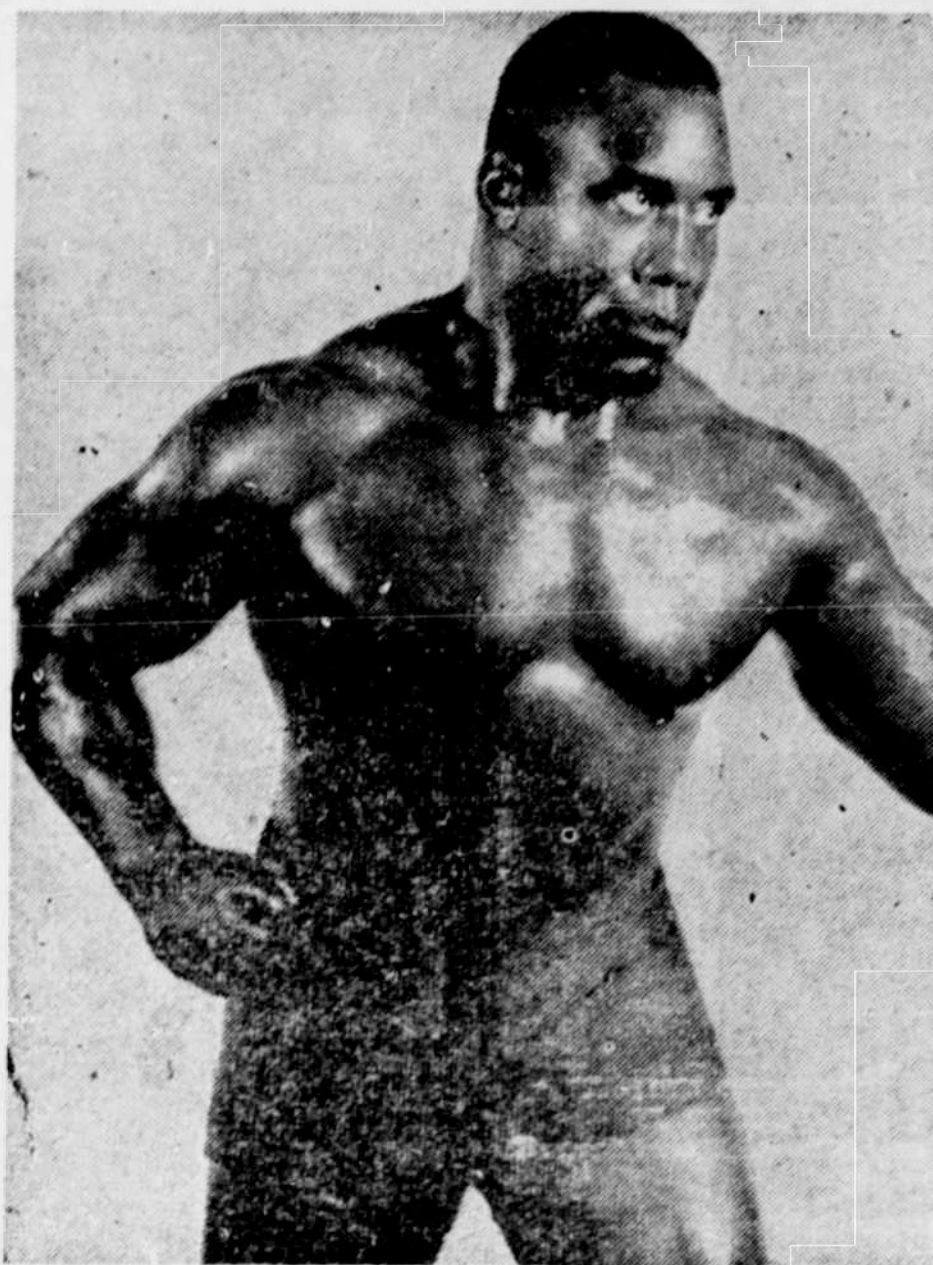
### RED CROSS DOES ITS XMAS SHOPPING EARLY

MIAMI, Florida—Months, in one case nearly three years in far off India, today were climaxed with a speedy air trip home for two Negro fighting men. Flown to Air Transport Command's Miami Army Air Field in giant ATC sky trains, they had cleared this Caribbean Division base in a matter of hours and headed for their homes.

Oldest of the duo in point of overseas service was Technician Fifth Grade Charlie F. Preston, 2, Milner, Georgia, who served 31 months in the China-Burma theater with the Quartermaster Corps, and who wears two battle stars on his campaign ribbon.

Nearly twice Preston's age, Technical Sergeant William L. Johnson, 43, 162 Broadway, Santa Cruz, California, served just short of one year in the same theater with a unit of the Medical Corps. He is the wearer of one battle star.

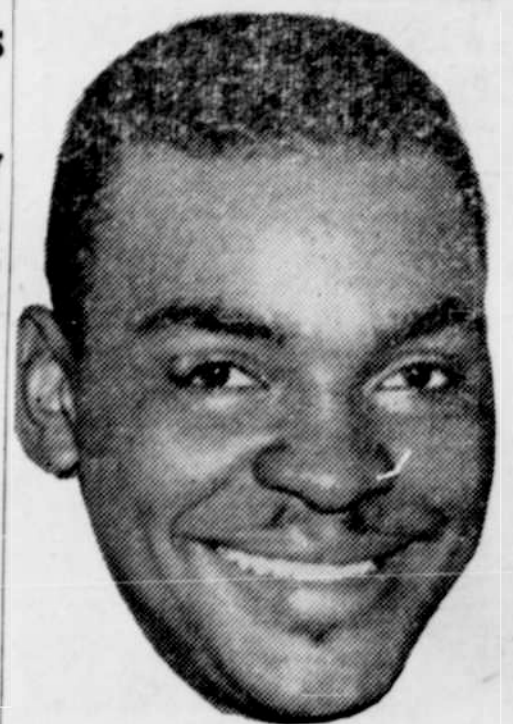

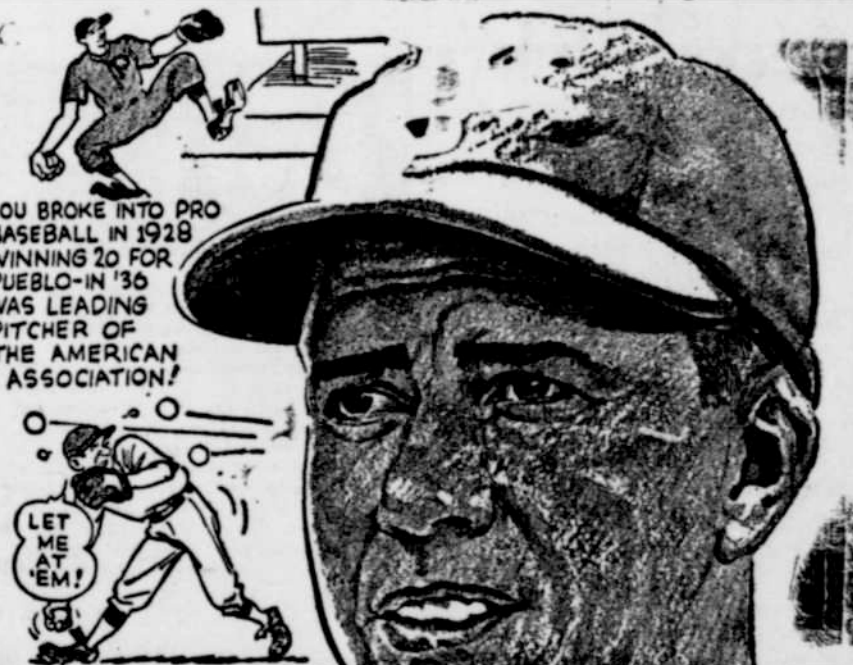
