## Veteran's News

Veterans should remember to keep their national service life insurance policies paid up after discharge from the service, Hugh E. Rosson, director of the state Department of Veterans' Affairs, advised this week. The fact that a man is discharged from the armed forces does not terminate this insurance, provided he continues the premium payments, Mr. Rosson explained.

If the veteran has allowed his insurance to lapse, however, he may have it reinstated, either within six months after date of discharge or within three months after date of lapse, whichever is later, by payment of only two monthly premiums without interest and by filing a statement showing that he is in as good health as he was on the date of

After expiration of the two periods stated above, the veteran must be in good health and furnish satisfactory evidence thereof in the form of a complete physical examination. This examination may be obtained free through the Veterans' Administration. Other facts to remember: 1. First premium payment after discharge is usually payable during the first month of discharge.

2. Always show policy number when making payment.

3. If number is not known, payment should be accomplished by a letter giving name, serial number, rank ,organization, and date of birth.

4. At any time after the policy is in force for one year, but before the expiration of eight years, it should be converted into ordinary life, 20-payment life, or 30-payment life policies.

5. Checks, drafts, or money orders for premium payments should be made payable to the Treasurer of the United States and sent to: Collections Subdivision, Veterans' Administration, Washington 25, D. C.

## Massachusetts' Governor Seeks FEPC Law

BOSTON-(ANP)-The liquidation of the federal FEPC here may soon be followed by a state fair employment practice law patterned on New York state's Negro Student Ives - Quinn anti - discrimination

Backing of such a measure is said to be favored by Gov. Maurice J. Tobin, who recently received unanimous report in behalf of the New York law from a committee he appointed to study the results of closing federal FE-PC offices here.

The committee reported that both the New York and New Jersey FEPC laws have a "very salutary effect upon employers and employees alike."

The proposed law would improve on a measure killed by the Republican-controlled state serate last year, in that it would provide fines of \$500 or one year's imprisonment, or both, for each offense. The old measure lacked teeth.

# Says Vets' Rights Are Abridged in Legion Charter

PHILADELPHIA - (ANP) -Rights of Negro veterans have been abridged by the American Legion's refusal to grant them charter rights in five southern

That stand was taken here last week by the National Baptist veterans in stating their policy. The Rev. Bertram E. Barton, commander-in-chief, said:

"Since the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States are supposed to issue charters to any group of veterans who served under the American flag and are honorably discharged or whose present military services, are honorable, regardless of race, creed or color or previous conditions of servitude.

"Their past and present tendency to differentiate in many of the southern states when the personnel is colored is directly against the principles of these organizations and against the principles for which congressional charters were granted them."

Since such prejudices exist in these national organizations and since the majority of the personnel of the Veterans administration is from these organizations," Barton questioned whether the Negro veterans gets proper and unbiased consideration in his claims for benefits."

The National Baptist veterans organized because the "constitutional rights of colored veterans are abridged," said Barton.
