Mock Cherry Pie

Mock Cherry Pie

Cook 2 cups cranberries and 1/2 cup water in covered saucepan until they pop (3 to 5 minutes). Add 1/2 cup sugar and blend. When cool, add 1 cup raisins, 2 tablespoons flour, 1/2 cup corn sirup, and a dash of salt.

Tender, Flaky Pastry

Mix 2 cups sifted All-Purpose Flour and 1 teaspoon salt. Measure out 3/4 cup Spry.

Step 1 for Tenderness—cut in about 3/4 of the Spry with pastry blender or two knives as fine as meal.

Step 2 for Flakiness—cut in remaining Spry to size of large peas. Sprinkle 4 tablespoons cold water over different parts of mixture. Mix thoroughly, with fork, until all particles cling together and form a ball of dough. Roll 3/4 of pastry dough and line a 9-inch pie plate. Fill pie shell with fruit mixture. Roll remaining dough and cut in narrow strips about 3/8 inch wide. Place strips over filling in crisscross fashion. Bake in hot oven (425°F.) 35-45 minutes. Serves 8.

"Good Morning" Griddle Cakes



Extra light, golden-brown hot cakes, to start the day right

No coaxing the family to eat breakfast—they'll come running to the table, when you serve these tender, light hot cakes, with honey or maple sirup and crusty-brown sausages! You'll have to keep stepping to make enough hot cakes for them—and no wonder, for these griddle cakes wake up lazy appetites.

GRIDDLE CAKES

2 cups sifted flour
4 teaspoons baking powder
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
3/4 cup Spry
4 egg yolks, beaten
2 cups milk
4 egg whites, beaten stiff

Sift flour with baking powder and salt. Cut in Spry fine. Combine egg yolks and milk. Turn liquids into dry ingredients slowly and mix until well blended. Fold egg whites into batter. Drop by spoonfuls on hot griddle rubbed with Spry. When cakes puff and bubble, turn and brown on the other side. Remove from griddle and serve hot—plain or rolled up. Serves 6.
