The foundation gave \$25,000 to the United Negro College fund; \$25,000 to the Boy Scouts of America, "for provision of camping facilities for Negro scouts in southwestern states on a cooperative basis with communities," and \$5,000 to the National Urban league.

Negro victims of infantile paralysis at Tuskegee Institute have received more than \$850,000 during the past five years announced Basil O'Connor, president of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis. The Tuskegee Paralysis center is the main hospital for treatment of Negro poliomyelitis patients and training of Negro physicians and nurses in the care of polio patients.

Dr. Charles Drew, noted for his development of blood plasma, and professor of medicine at Howard University, was elected a vice president of the American-Soviet Medical society at its second annual meeting in Philadelphia. The only other Negro delegate at the conference was Dr. J. Leonidas Leach, of Flint, Michigan, who represented the Michigan chapter of the society and who nominated Dr. Drew.

The nation's first Negro win-Sgt. Jerry B. Davis, of Macon, Ga., who won the rare honor for heroism while serving with the 92nd division in Italy. During the battle for Pisa in August, 1945, he raced across a shell-swept open area to get food for isolated artillery group which had been pinned down to their position because of the intense enemy fire.
