The contract has been let for the work of construction on the Oregon Pacific railroad eastward of Albany to the summit of the Cascade mountains. Contractor Nelson Bennett, who has been engaged in railroad work on the Northern Pacific, secured the contract for the construction of forty miles of the new road.
