THE W. F. & C. M. INVESTIGATION.

The government wagon road commissioners, Hon. G. C. Wharton and J. B. McNamee, continued their land grant examination in this city on last Monday, hearing witnesses in the Willamette Valley & Cascade Mountain wagon road case.

These men are all residents of different portions of Oregon contiguous to the road, and are all familiar with the history of the road. They all agreed in their testimony that the road had been honestly surveyed in a manner conforming to the provisions of the act under which the grant was made.

Several of the witnesses above-named were owners of stock in the original company which pretended to build the road, and as a matter of course their testimony would be that the road was "honestly constructed."

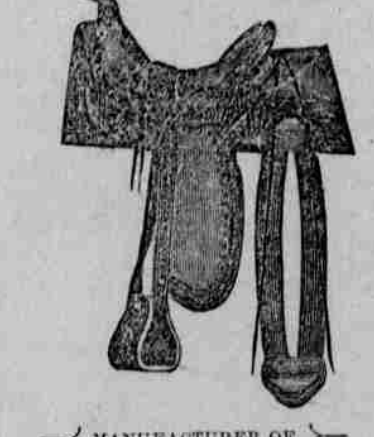
