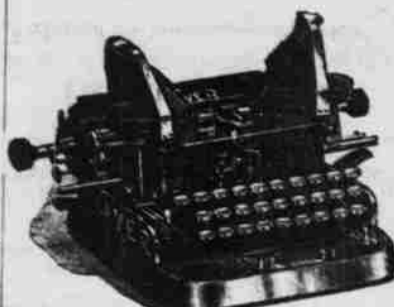

The Corbett forces have adopted a resolution declaring their determination to stay with him to the end of the session. This makes the election of any other candidate impossible with out the aid of democratic votes, and also makes Corbett's election very doubtful, as any defection to him at this late day will carry the suspicion of having been fixed with Corbett's money. It looks now as though there will be no election, as up to the hour of going to press, the vote remains unchanged.

The postoffice department will next September advertise for bids on all star routes in Oregon for carrying the mails including the delivery by the carrier to each person along the route who will erect and maintain a suitable box for the purpose, of his mail free of charge, the contract price to cover such free delivery. On every route information is now being sought as to how many persons would probably be served, how many boxes would be erected and how much time should be allowed the carrier on each trip, if the box delivery service were required. That such service will be greatly appreciated in these sparsely settled regions goes without saying, and the only wonder is that the system was not adopted long ago.

Crooked river was higher last Sunday morning than it has known for years. Many bridges have been washed away and roads damaged. Fuller & Co. lost quite a number of fat hogs at their feeding pens on the river bottom south of town by their being washed away and chilled to death in the water. Had not the weather opportunely turned colder great damage might have been done as both bridges west of town were on the point of giving way. The heavy rain and snow which has since fallen will be, notwithstanding the washouts of immense value to the farming and stock interests as the former thoroughly saturated the soil and the latter will afford abundant water for irrigation next summer.

The spectacle of the Oregon legislature being held up every two years by some senatorial aspirant whose money is his chief attribute of fitness is becoming exceedingly stale and trying to the eyes of honest men. Admit that Corbett is a statesman; admit that his financial ability is unequalled; that his honesty and integrity are above reproach; admit that he is the equal in every respect of any other aspirant and the fact remains that the people do not want him. Should he be elected he will have bought the place, defrauded the people of their choice, debauched the legislature and debased himself. The gang of hirlings that surround and the legislators who are carrying a part of his wealth in their inside pockets are but mercenary tools who should have no place in a republic. We have no prejudice against Corbett as a citizen but against his political methods we are unalterably opposed. Better no senator from Oregon than to have the name of having been bought, body, soul and bones.
