In the new process of welding invent ed by Dr. Goldschmidt, of Essen, a com pound called "thermit," made of alu ninum and certain metallic oxides, is employed to obtain an extraordinary degree of heat. With the aid of a melting-pot, rails and pipes can be imme diately welded at any place. The pot being filled with an inflammable mixture and ignited, a few spoonfuls of thermit are added, and the temperature quickly rises as high as 3,000 degrees Centigrade. An aluminum oxide is then poured on the part of the rail, or pipe, to be welded, and the work is done, quickly that the pot is cold and can be taken into the hand after being emp-

er resident in the Klondyke, the inhabitants of that region suffer much from snow blindness. Dark glasses seem to be of no value in the way of prophylaxis. That which afforded the most protection was wooden goggles, the patterns for which were taken from those worn by the Indians. 
