

County Court Proceedings.

The county court met in regular session on Wednesday, May 1. The full board being present the following proceedings were had:

In the matter of the resignation of T. R. Carl as road supervisor, resignation accepted and J. H. Gray appointed to serve unexpired term.

In the matter of road petition of Charlotte Hanna et al, road ordered viewed and W. H. Pock, Ernest Wiegand and Henry Windom appointed viewers to meet on the 17th day of May. Charley Graves surveyor.

In the matter of the resignation of J. C. Eason road supervisor district 7, resignation accepted report approved and supervisor allowed \$21. Henry Graves appointed.

In the matter of the resignation of J. S. Wuzler supervisor road district No. 13, resignation accepted, supervisor allowed 20 cents and Richard Breeze appointed to fill unexpired term.

In the matter of the resignation of P. B. Doak supervisor of road district No. 8, resignation accepted and Albert Lucas appointed.

In the matter of report of S. M. Courtney supervisor of road district No. 20, report approved and clerk ordered to furnish list of delinquent road work to the supervisor.

In the matter of fixing bonds of supervisors, court ordered that each and every supervisor in Crook county be required to give a good and sufficient bond to Crook county in the sum of \$500 in accordance with legislative enactment approved Feb. 25, 1901. It is further ordered that the clerk notify all supervisors who were not notified by order of court at March term to proceed forth with to call out all labor due and to have the same worked as by law provided.

In the matter of tax rolls of 1896, 1897, 1898, 1899 and 1900, clerk ordered to attach warrants returnable 60 days from May 6, 1901.

State Veterinarian McLean was at Salem last week in consultation with Governor Geer and Secretary of State Dunbar, in regard to the eradication of mange among horses in Eastern Oregon. No definite arrangement was agreed to further than that the state authorities will co-operate as far as possible with the county authorities in preventing a spread of the disease. This probably means that the state will give two or three of the north-eastern counties financial assistance.

Notice to Contractors.

Notice is hereby given that bids will be received by the county court of Crook county for the construction and furnishing of material for the Young bridge across Crooked river. The same to be in accordance with plans and specifications now on file with the clerk of said court at the court house in Prineville Oregon. The contract to be let to the lowest responsible bidder for cash. Said bridge and approachment to be completed on or before the first day of November, A. D. 1901. Payment to be made as follows: One third when the timbers used in the construction are on the ground, one third when the necessary irons are on the ground and the balance when the bridge is completed and accepted by the court. The successful bidder must furnish a bond approved by the county judge, in the sum of \$1500 within two days after the contract is awarded and in case of failure to furnish such approved bond the contract will be awarded to the next lowest bidder.

The court reserves the right to reject any and all bids. Said bids shall be sealed bids to be opened at a special meeting of the court at 10 o'clock a. m., June 1, 1901, and contract awarded in open court.
