SOCIALIST PARTY. Albany Herald.

At a recent meeting of socialists held in Albany steps were taken to organize a state "Socialist Party." The leaders of the movement are the same who were formerly foremost in the populist party. Since the populist lamb and democratic lion laid down together, with the result that the lamb followed the ancient story and was promptly swallowed by the lion, these reform leaders have been out a job. These versatile gentlemen, however, have now bobbed up serenely with a bran new party, which they declare will be launched into the political arena and will be in good running order in time for the campaign in Oregon next year.

At the recent meeting held a temporary executive committee, consisting of C. S. Harnish, W. S. Richards and A. C. Llewelling was named, and this committee was authorized to issue a call for a state convention not later than October 1, at which time it is expected that a permanent organization will be effected. The preliminary declarations of principles promulgated at the meeting in Albany are:

First, We believe in public ownership of all the means of production and distribution.

Second, Equal suffrage, without distinction on account of sex.

Third, Direct legislation through the initiative and referendum and imperative mandate.

These are no doubt to be elaborated into a platform to cover about all the reforms needed on the face of the earth and some under the sea. However, the first ought to be sweeping enough to satisfy the most ardent socialist and to draw to the party all those who have nothing and want those who have to divide up.

The populist party, which for some time previous to its demise was simply a democratic sideshow, having outlived its usefulness, it is not unexpected to see a new show started.
