Written tests for the present school months are now in progress in the V and VI grades.

In a spelling contest held in Miss Belknap's room last week, Edgar Barnes come out champion.

A number of pupils have been dismissed from school on a account of them being exposed to scarlet fever.

The V grade pupils are doing excellent in addition in the advanced arithmetic. The language work is also very good.

VI grade pupils are experiencing some trouble with fractions, being compelled to omit a great deal of review work in placing the school on the state course of study. In the future this class will have two recitations a day in arithmetic, one in mental and one written work. Excellent work is being done in geography. The class is at present reviewing Asia.

Mrs L. M. Hodges, Mrs Isom Cleek, Miss Frankie Dillon and Miss Montgomery, were visitors last week.

The State Board of Education has formulated new rules for the conducting of eight grade final examination through the state. A copy of these rules has been posted in Prof Ortens room. These examinations are conducted in very much the same manner as examinations for teachers Certificates. In the future the eight grade examinations will be held in February, April, May, and June, on such days as the State Superintendent may indicate. In order to secure a public school diploma a pupil must make an average of not less 80 per cent and not fall below 70 per cent in any one branch. Should a pupil fail in one examination, he is permitted to take following examination and if successful, to receive a Diploma in accordance with the result of the two examinations. This diploma entitles the holder to enter in the state without further examination. There has been several cases of tardiness during the past week. If parents knew how this interferes with the work of the school, they would, no doubt, see that their children were started from home in plenty of time.
