Big Bend Electric Railway.

SPOKANE, Feb. 28.-I. E. Moses, of Seattle, met the farmers of the Big Bend country at Waterville this afternoon and discussed contracts for an electric railway extending from the Great Northern Road at Rock Island and about 60 | miles north and east of Waterville and Buckingham. Power is to be taken from Chelan Falls. The proposed contracts call for the building of 30 miles of road within one year and completing the entireroad by December, 1905. The road would handle both freight and passengers. Farmers within 10 miles of the line are asked for a bonus ranging from \$5 to \$50 per quarter section. The promoters refused to tell who is expected to provide the capital.




