

County Court Proceedings.

The Commissioner's Court convened on Wednesday March 5, with County Judge W. C. Wills, Commissioners David Templeton and H. J. Healey, Clerk J. J. Smith and Sheriff W. C. Congleton present. The following proceedings were then had.

In the matter of the resignation of J. H. Lafollet from the election board of McKay precinct No. 7. Ordered that resignation be accepted and that L. W. Spear be and is hereby appointed to fill said vacancy.

In the matter of the appointment of a justice of the peace for Cross Keys precinct: Ordered that E. G. Bolter be and is hereby appointed justice of the peace for said precinct.

In the matter of the appointment of a justice of the peace for Summit precinct: Ordered that W. J. Schmidt be and is hereby appointed justice for said precinct.

In the matter of a change in the county road as prayed for in the petition of N. A. Newbill: Report of viewers showing that petitioners were not satisfied with the route taken by said petition it is ordered that no further proceedings be taken in the matter and that the same be dismissed; petitioners to pay all costs in the proceedings.

In the matter of the application of W. H. Grizzle for cash to prove up on homestead: Warrant ordered drawn in favor of J. J. Smith for the sum of \$8.

In the matter of the appointment of a justice of the peace for Kuteher precinct: Ordered that U. S. Cowles be and is hereby appointed justice for said precinct.

In the matter of the petition of D. F. Steffa et al for the annulment of the appointment of M. C. Awbrey as a member of the election board for Bend precinct: It appearing from affidavit of date of March 3 1902 on file in this court, made by M. C. Awbrey before M. E. Brink notary public, that M. C. Awbrey is now and has been a resident of Bend precinct for past fifteen years, the prayer of D. F. Steffa et al for his removal is refused.

In the matter of the petition of Robert Smith for ferry license on the Deschutes river: Petition refused for the reason that the land on the west side of the Deschutes river is vested in private ownership and that proper notice was not served. And further that U. S. Cowles by voluntary appearance has signified by his petition, duly presented to this court, that he desires to avail himself of his right as owner of the land to establish a ferry and collect tolls.

In the matter of the report of W. T. Davenport, road supervisor: Report approved. Supervisor allowed \$56 and warrant ordered drawn in his favor for that amount.

In the matter of the report of Henry Grimes road supervisor: Supervisor allowed \$22 and warrant ordered drawn in his favor for said amount. Clerk directed to notify supervisor to collect delinquent road taxes forthwith by placing the same in the hands of the sheriff for collection if necessary.

In the matter of the wrongful assessment of the Baldwin Sheep & Land Co: The Court having examined the application, but having been fully advised in the premises by the attorney for the state, deem the application should be made to the sheriff of the county as by law provided for the relief therein prayed for, and therefore refuse to act in the matter at this time.

In the matter of the application of E. S. Cowles for ferry license on the Deschutes river: Prayer of petitioner refused for the reason that this court has no jurisdiction over land upon a government reservation and for the further reason that Robert Smith by petition presented to this court himself offers to establish a ferry on the premises.

In the matter of the petition of Andrew Morrow et al to vacate a part of the Lone Pine road: Petition read

and considered. Due proof of notices submitted, bond filed and approved. Viewers are appointed as follows: I. W. Spear, Samuel Collins and Marion Templeton. Charles Graves surveyor. Said viewers and surveyor to meet at place of beginning on April 14 at 10 o'clock a. m.

In the matter of the petition of W. T. Davenport et al for county road: Petition read and the following persons appointed viewers: Frank Forest, D. A. McDowell and John Harris; Charles Graves, surveyor; to meet at place of beginning on Monday the 21st day of April 1902. Bond approved March 5 1902.

In the matter of the resignation of J. M. Montgomery as election judge in Montgomery precinct: Resignation accepted and ordered that G. W. Dodson be and he is hereby appointed to fill said vacancy.

In the matter of the protest of Robert Smith: Application refused under protest for the reason that U. S. Cowles is the owner of the land on the west bank of the Deschutes river at the place of landing of the ferry applied for and it would require a legal notice to be served on said U. S. Cowles and said legal notice was not given.

In the matter of the resignation of J. E. Roberts as judge of election for Bear creek precinct: Resignation accepted and C. H. Dealey appointed to fill vacancy.

In the matter of the resignation of E. S. Dobbs as judge of election in precinct No. 14: Resignation accepted and J. F. Miller appointed to fill vacancy.
